

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

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WHY IS AN EYE EXAM IMPORTANT?



To keep you seeing your best by making sure your glasses/ contact lenses are up to date and that your eyes are healthy.

Periodic eye and vision examinations are an important part of preventive health care. Many eye and vision problems have no obvious signs or symptoms. As a result, individuals are often unaware that problems exist. Early diagnosis and treatment of eye and vision problems are important for maintaining good vision and eye health, and when possible, preventing vision loss.

In addition to detecting eye disease, eye exams can detect major health issues such as diabetes, MS and more.

CHILDREN'S VISION




Many experts believe that approximately 80 percent of learning comes through a child's eyes. Despite the strong correlation between vision and learning, many

Americans underestimate the number of children affected by eye and vision problems.

"Because a child's vision may change frequently, regular eye and vision care is crucial to a student's classroom success," said Dr. Michael Earley, optometrist and the AOA's vision & learning specialist. Children should have their first eye check at 18 months of age. The retina is going through the "critical development" at this age. Early exams can prevent the child from developing "lazy eye," which is a term for an undeveloped retina.

TECHNOLOGY TO HELP YOU KEEP YOUR VISION



Optical Coherence Tomography (OCT) is used to measure the thickness of the nerve layer behind the retina. This layer cannot be viewed during eye exam, but can be measured using OCT technology. OCT has become a critical tool in the fight against

many eye diseases, especially the top three known to cause blindness – macular degeneration, diabetic retinopathy and glaucoma. We are proud to offer the Zeiss HD OCT.




RETINA IMAGING

Retinal imaging is important to examine & document the structure of the retina including the Optic Nerve Head (ONH) & Macula.

By creating a "baseline" we can monitor for changes over time to help with early detection of eye disease including Glaucoma.

Most eye disease is treatable and vision can be preserved with early detection.



SPECIALIZATIONS

Dry Eye:

Do your eyes itch, burn, become red? If so, you may be suffering with chronic dry eye. We have many treatments for dry eye to help your eyes look and feel better.

Punctal plugs, Restasis, topical tear replacement, oral supplements, and a new technology called "lipiflow" can be utilized. Let's start with an evaluation to determine the cause of the dryness, we'll be able to recommend a treatment plan designed specifically for you.

Diabetic Eye Exams:

If you have diabetes, it is important to have a comprehensive eye exam at least once per year. Diabetes can cause changes in your eye glass prescription and, even more importantly, can cause hemorrhages to form in the retina (diabetic retinopathy).

Contact Lens Exams:

We offer many types of contact lenses, including "multifocal" for the "over 40" age group, "Toric" for people with astigmatism, Rigid lenses for people with keratoconus, "Synergeyes," for people who need a rigid lens, but want the comfort of a soft lens... and "custom contact lens tinting" for people who want to change their eye color. In addition to daily wear and extended wear contacts.

Surgical Procedures:

Our doctors specialize in providing your pre and post operative surgical care for LASIK, Cataract Surgery, and Custom IOL's.

We also remove foreign bodies from the eye, and insert punctal plugs for treatment of dry eye
