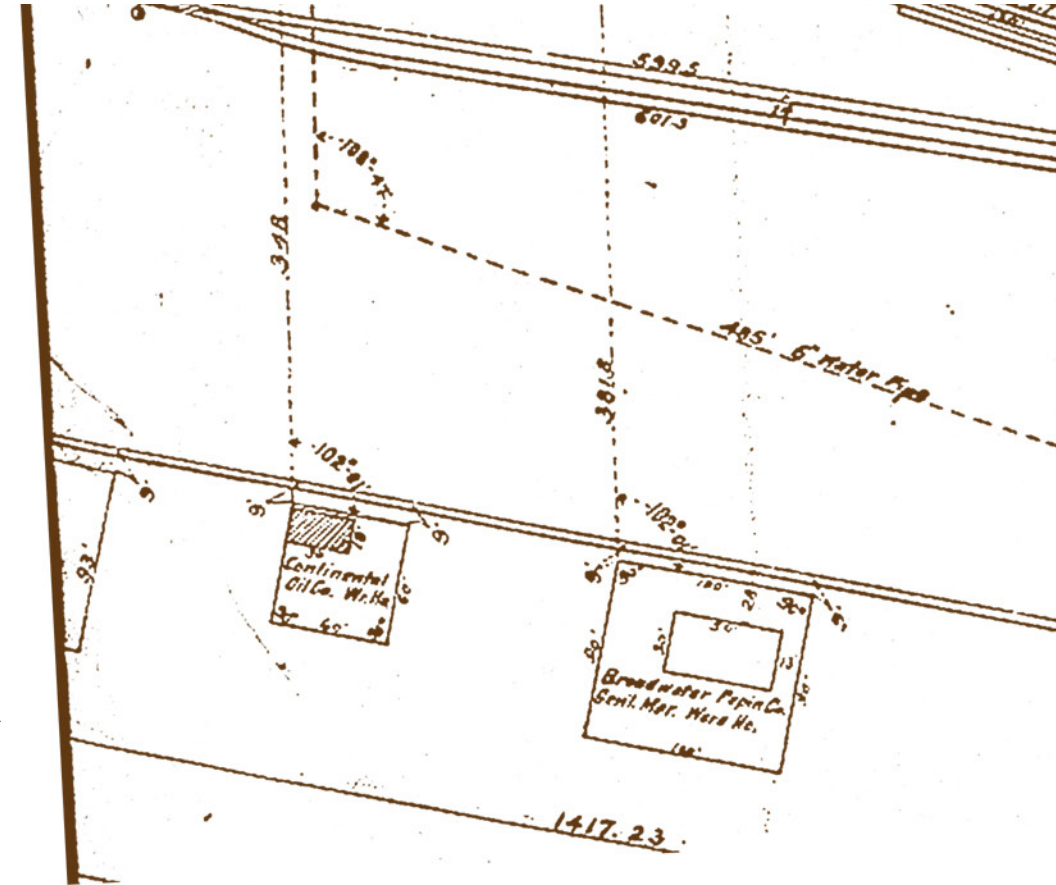


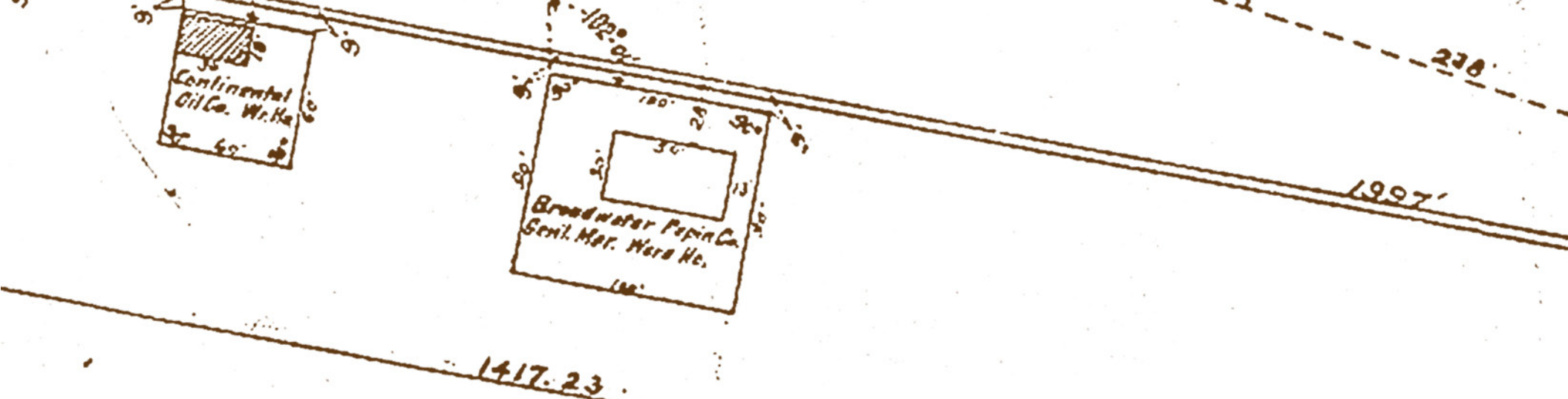
De La Salle University-Dasmariñas Annual Report 2009-2010



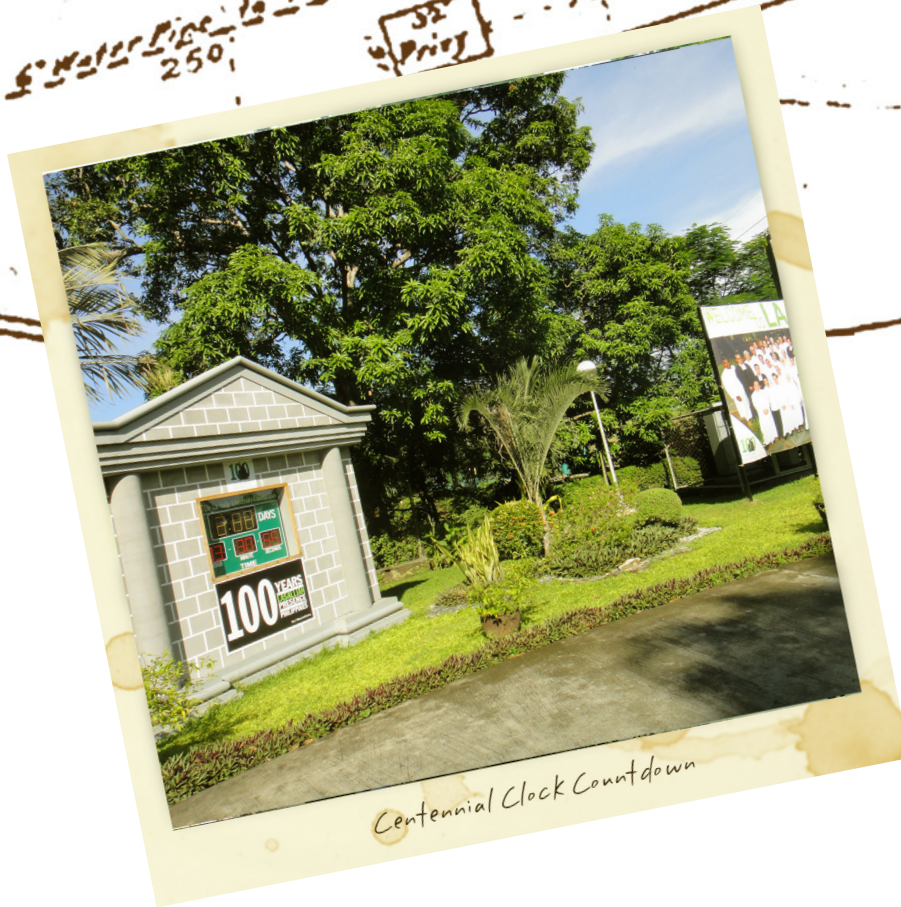

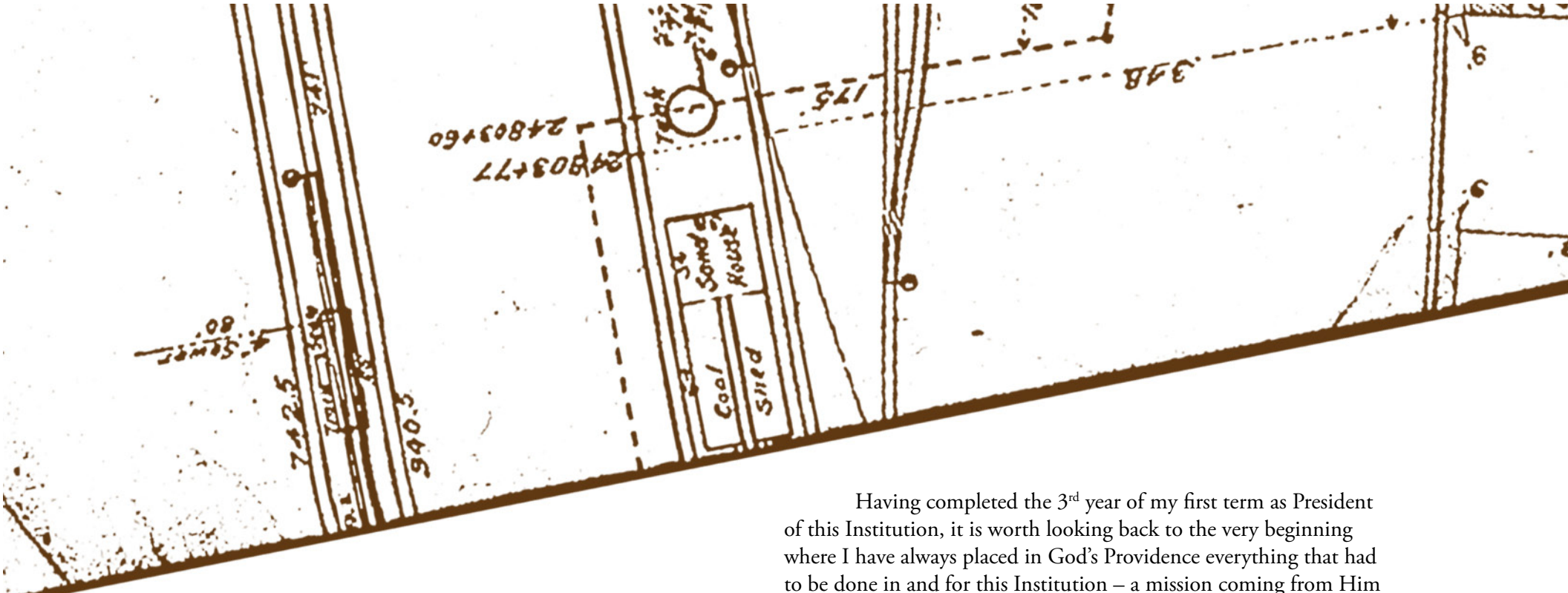



# 14 POINT AGENDA

1. We have two very beautiful environmentally friendly campuses where I would like to help create an ideal climate within De La Salle University-Dasmariñas and De La Salle Health Sciences Campus where in each Institution, the experience of God is lived and shared. This is my first responsibility as animator.
2. Our quest for academic excellence should be pursued with great determination through the quality of our instruction in the classroom. This shall be complemented by setting up the mechanics to increase steadily our numbers of educationally gifted full scholars, to include those coming from the Public Schools, and financially struggling families from other private schools within the next four schoolyears. By 2011, we aim to have 20% full scholars.
3. We take cognizance that the life of an academic tertiary institution will remain healthy if we pursue vigorously research such as in support of medical discoveries, quality of instruction, and development programs. Such Research materials must be published once a year as service to the academe.
4. The relevance of a wholistic Lasallian education is manifested by our being true to our mission and vision as catalysts for social transformation of our society. We must begin working on an acceptable evaluation tool that would address this matter.
5. The nurturing and strengthening of our faculty and support staff and their quality of life as instruments in the formation of our students, will be given utmost attention.
6. Our campus facilities, in aid of instruction and development, should undergo a scheduled program for upgrading. This is very essential. A specific time-table properly monitored, shall be set-up.
7. With so many poor patients coming to the University Medical Center for consultation and treatment, there is a felt need to make a formal study to increase the number of beds in our Charity Ward steadily in the next four schoolyears – including correlated needs such as needed medical equipment, subsidized medicine from Pharmaceutical Laboratories, and the Intensive Care Unit's needs.
8. We need to begin a long term sustained program for international linkages with academic organizations, institutions of higher learning, research organizations, United Nations Support Agencies, and Project Grantors in aid of instruction, research, faculty development, student exchanges, community extension, and our University Medical Center, especially the Charity Ward.
9. We shall aim to reach Level 4 from our present Level 3 in our accreditation level while pursuing with the Commission on Higher Education the grant for autonomous status to complement our Deregulated Status.

10. Active partnership between the academe and government is highly encouraged.  
I would like to address four major areas that we will initiate as proposals for services:
- 10.1 A training program for the professional development of our Public School Teachers through grants from benefactors to be approached.
  - 10.2 Provide support from the academe on the needs of the Municipality of Dasmariñas and Province of Cavite where we can be of assistance in addressing Peace and Order issues and concerns that can become a model for the nation.  
We have good and capable public officials in the Province of Cavite.
  - 10.3 Establish linkages with our Local and Provincial Governments in support of our College of Law Enforcement for greater service to the entire Province of Cavite.
  - 10.4 Given the best features of our two Institutions, we can help much in the promotion of Cavite as a local and International Tourist destination.
11. Creative undertakings need to be set-up via a feasibility study ready for implementation in a scheduled time-table towards the establishment of an Entrepreneurial Skills Development Program among our marginalized in Cavite, who find difficulties getting a decent job or means of livelihood for their families.
12. Our youth at risk, notably “Children in conflict with the Law need urgent help.” We are now in the process of doing a formal study, to put up a Center with a Program that would effectively address this grave concern – with a time-table for implementation. This shall be a Center with a Program that will rely on Divine Providence and the goodness of the hearts of those who believe in this noble cause.
13. Support for the church and the Diocese of Imus shall be undertaken actively by our two Institutions. Our Bishop, who is a member of our two Boards of Trustees, shall be invited to become a vital part of our Animation Team. Our clergy deserves our all-out support.
14. A Pastoral Accompaniment Program among our students towards a better appreciation of the De La Salle Brothers Vocation shall be actively pursued with our Lasallian Partners involved with the end in view of seeing more interests and commitments among our Contacts towards becoming Aspirants – and ultimately Postulants.

The schoolyear 2007-2008 marked new beginnings for De La Salle University- Dasmariñas. Br. Gus Boquer FSC, EdD officially assumed his post as president of DLSU-D on May 16, 2007. The Board of Trustees approved the new logo on Sept. 5, 2007. The University adapted its new tagline “Creating possibilities.”

It was a year of possibilities for service – with the University’s aim to have 20 percent full scholars by 2011, and the partnerships forged with the government. For the scholarship project, the University allotted Php25,026,000.00 for its budget. Aside from this, different offices and departments in the University chipped in and made their contribution for the fulfillment of this goal. With this, the University received a total of Php12.9 million in donations, a very impressive 122 percent increase from the previous schoolyear.

It was a year of possibilities for formation— with the establishment of Bahay Pag-asa, Dasmariñas. Bahay Pag-asa is a transformation center for children aged 15 to 17 who are in conflict with the law. Programs instilling the meaning of De La Salle Brothers Vocation as catalyst for social transformation through education have also been presented to the academic community. Finally, the University also made efforts in strengthening ties with and extending support to the church, specifically to the Diocese of Imus.

It was a year of possibilities for research—with research outputs published in refereed journals of Education, Science and Technology, Humanities, and Business. Four books on Cavite history were launched: *Naic: Kasaysayan ng Lokal mula Panahon ng Kastila Hanggang Panahon ng Hapon* by College of Liberal Arts Dean Emmanuel Calairo, *Pantyon: Ilang Pamahin, Tradisyon at Kuwento ng Paglilibing sa Kabite* by Social Sciences Department faculty Jeffrey Lubang, *Bahra: The History, Legends, Customs and Traditions of Ternate, Cavite* by Dr. Evangelino Nigoza, and *The Ternateños:*

*Their History, Languages, Customs, and Traditions* by Prof. Esteban de Ocampo.

It was a year of possibilities for innovation— with the line-up of projects aimed for upgrading and improving the University’s physical and IT facilities, social awareness and academic status. The University’s goal in social transformation, divided into five components: advocacy, education and formation, health enterprise and development, and research and linkages, is promptly being accomplished.

The graduate programs in the colleges of Liberal Arts, Science, and Education were granted clean accreditation during the Philippine Association of Accrediting Schools, Colleges, and Universities (PAASCU) formal survey visit in September 2007. The schoolyear saw the thorough preparations being made in the undergraduate programs for the February 2009 Level 3 Re-accreditation visit of the members of the PAASCU.

By schoolyear 2008-2009, DLSU-D upheld and proved that it is Cavite’s Premier University.

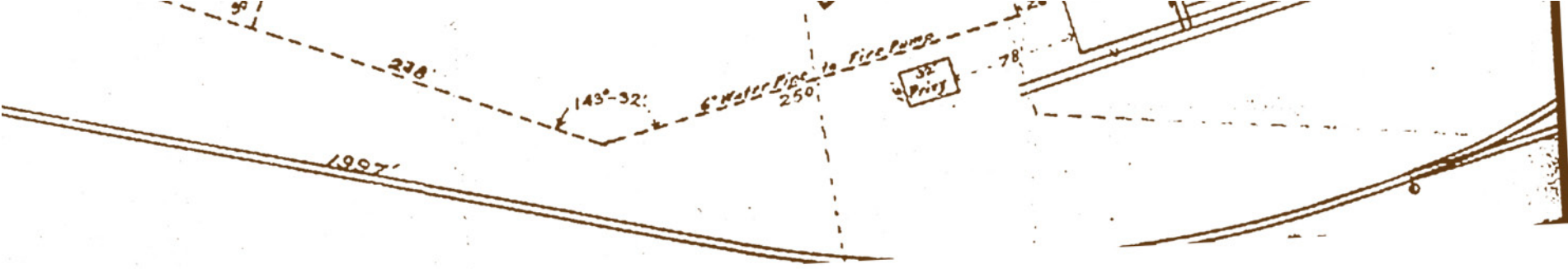
DLSU-D is known for its scholarship, with the University allotting more than Php 28.5 million for the scholarship budget. During the first semester, the University granted 1,751 students or 15.35 percent scholarship grants. By the second semester, there were 1,778 students or 16.52 percent scholarship grants.

Several accrediting agencies and highly recognized citations proved that DLSU-D is indeed Cavite’s premier.

The College of Liberal Arts, Science, Education and Business Administration including the Accountancy and Computer Science Programs were granted Level III Re-accreditation Status for a period of five years by the

Federation of Accrediting Association of the Philippines through PAASCU.

DLSU-D was granted Autonomous Status as it satisfies the three major criteria set by the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) namely: long tradition of integrity and untarnished reputation, commitment to excellence, and sustainability and viability of operations. The status was granted for a period of five years from March 11 2009 to March 30, 2014.

The University was officially conferred the Dark Green Status in the Philippines by the Environmental Education Network of the Philippines in recognition and confirmation of the University's commitment to promote and live out environmental awareness and protection.

The University, through the Office of Student Services, received the Best in Scholarship Program award given by CHED.

CHED awarded the Best HEI Research Program and the Best HEI Extension Program for 2008 to the Cavite Studies Center and the Lasallian Community Development Center, respectively.

Finally, DLSU-D's biggest proof of being Cavite's Premier is the formation of the Biggest Human Lasallian Star.

More than ten thousand Lasallians, including administrators, faculty, staff, students, alumni, and benefactors, witnessed and took part in the event that would forever be etched in their minds. As a big and bold attempt to enter the Guinness World Record for the biggest Human Lasallian Star, Lasallians marched their way to the University oval where the star, with a diameter of 87.42m and an area of 2,143 sq. m., was formed.

And as every Lasallian sang "Hail, hail, hail!" with their fists in the air and beaming pride in their hearts, it was then that the world actually stopped. Not because of the Lasallian star made out of more than ten thousand people. It was because of the faith that resonated from the more than ten thousand Lasallians that nothing is impossible as long as everyone believes and comes together to fulfill one goal.





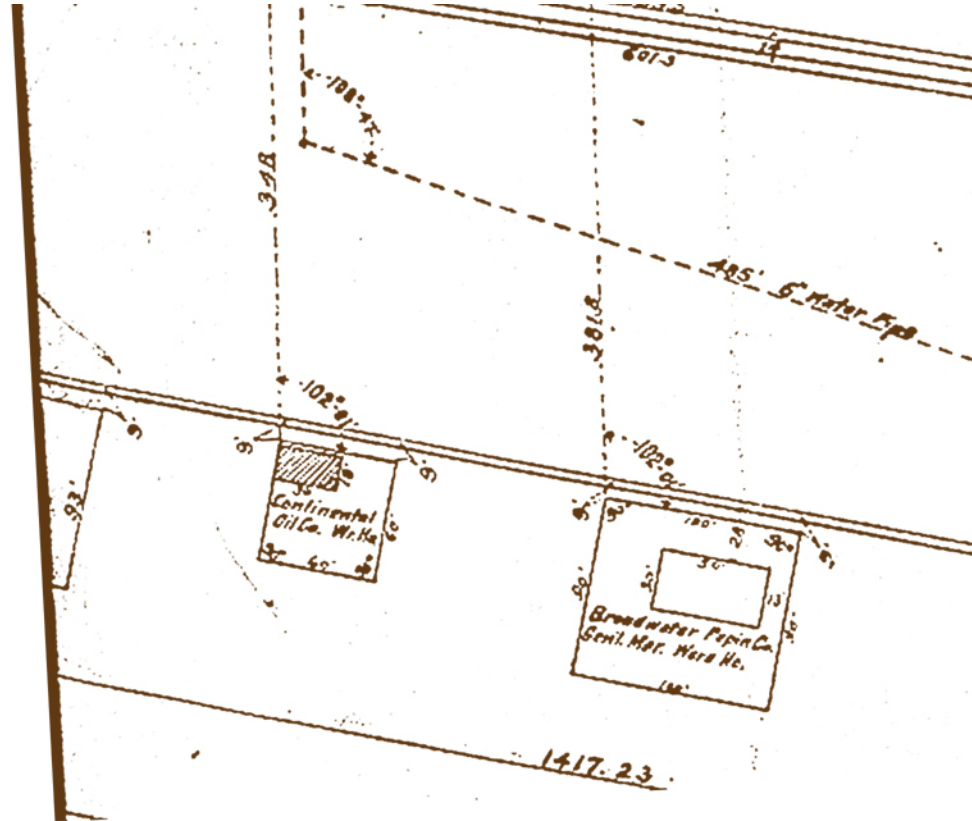
The enrollment figures for schoolyear 2009-2010 towards the second semester showed 4.88 percent increase from that of the previous years. The figure for the first semester reached 12, 646 enrollees in the graduate, undergraduate, and non-degree programs. A total of 11, 879 students were enrolled in the second semester while summer term recorded a total of 3, 965.

The academic workforce has also increased in number and continued to strive for professional advancement. For the first semester, 382 are regular support staff, 459 are full-time faculty members, of which 294 are master's degree holders and 74 are doctorate degree holders. There are 272 part-time faculty members, of which 96 are master's degree holders and 33 are doctorate degree holders.

For the second semester, two more faculty members were granted permanency, one more earned a master's degree and another earned a doctorate degree out of the 458 full time faculty members; of the 266 part-time faculty members, 85 are master's degree holders while 35 are doctorate degree holders.

In the summer term, 384 are regular support staff; 293 are master's degree holders while 77 are doctorate degree holders out of the 458 full-time faculty members.

Out of the 286 support staff, 252 have permanent status. There are 29 staff and nine Academic Service Personnel who are master's degree holders. For outsourced manpower, Almer Manpower Corporation was able to provide 103 personnel for janitorial needs and Combined Blue Dragon Security Services, Inc. designated 54 security officers responsible for orderly traffic flow and campus safety.

*Research*

There were 14 approved research projects for the first semester with two from the College of Business Administration (CBA), one from College of Engineering, Architecture and Technology (CEAT), one from the College of Liberal Arts (CLA), three from the College of Education (COE), six from the College of Science (COS) and one to be conducted by an Academic Service Faculty (ASF).

By the second semester, there were 31 approved research projects with five from CBA, one from College of Criminal Justice Education, nine from CLA, two from COE, 12 from COS and two to be conducted by an ASF.

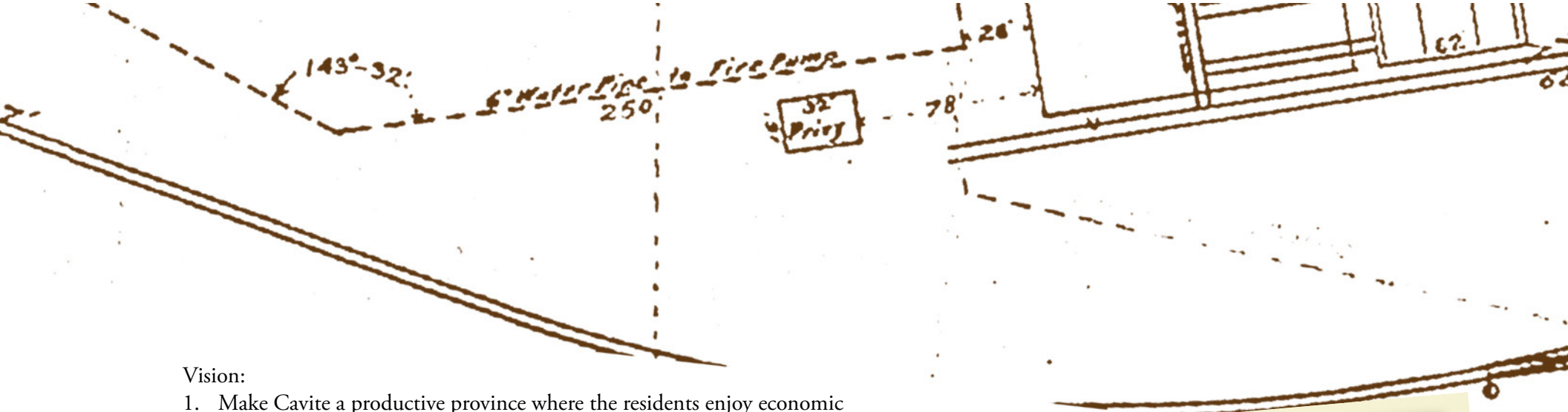

Curriculum mapping, module development and syllabus enhancements were discussed.

Another seminar was held on May 4, 2010 in preparation for the full implementation of the ELGA (Expected Lasallian Graduates Attributes)-based syllabus. ### *Board Performance*

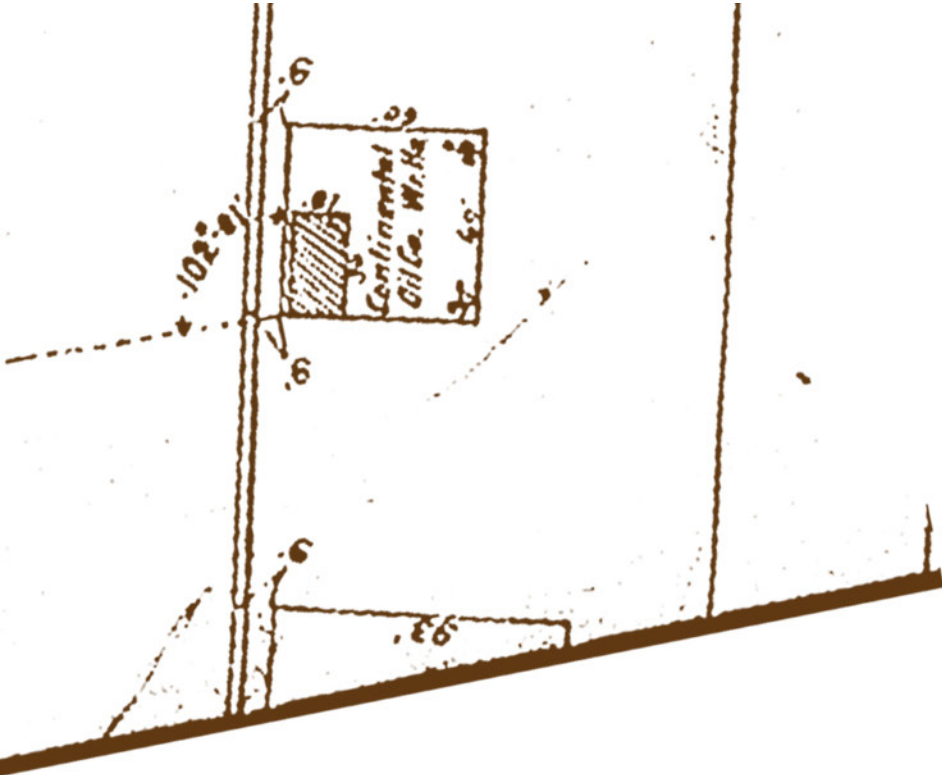
The College of Business Administration Accountancy Department posted a 100 percent school passing rate for the October 2009 Certified Public Accountants examinations (Category D: 10-25 examinees). DLSU-D graduate Laila Amon placed 2<sup>nd</sup> in the examination.

The College of Engineering, Architecture and Technology got a 100 percent passing rate during the January 2010 Architecture Licensure Examination and an 81.82 percent school passing rate above the national passing rate of 60.40 percent for the Mechanical Engineering October 2009 examinations. During the September 2009 Electrical Engineering examinations, the College posted a 75 percent school passing rate, with a 42.13 percent national passing rate, all of the passers are fresh graduates.

The College of Education posted a 72.73 percent passing rate for the elementary level and 73.44 percent for the secondary level. Moreover, the College got a 66.67 percent school passing rate during the MA in Guidance and Counseling board exams with DLSU-D Alumnae Doddie Marie Licudine-Duclan emerging 5<sup>th</sup> in the examination.

The College of Criminal Justice Education posted a 51 percent school passing rate above the national passing rate of 35.68 percent during the October 2009 Board Examinations.

True to its goal of extending service, the University has realized its noble mission through the following initiatives:

#### *Transformative Education programs*

Alternative Learning System curriculum implementation review was held at the Societas Vervi Divini (Divine Word Missionaries) SVD Tagaytay on September 18, 2009. The review was participated in by 16 instructional managers, four Lasallian Community Development Center faculty members, with Professional Education Department Chair Joel Espedido as resource speaker.

#### *Service to the community*

Medical mission at Brgy. Buro 2, City of Dasmariñas, Cavite, co-sponsored by the BSD on September 30, 2009. 53 patients were served.

Relief operations for typhoon victims begun on September 28, 2009. Served 85 families in two barangays in Dasmariñas, 263 families in Ternate, and 1,060 families in Taytay, Rizal.

#### *Advocacy*

IVote 2010 on September 8-11, 2009 at the Severino de las Alas Hall Auditorium with 1,050 participants.

A march was held on December 9, 2009 to commemorate the International Day of Action Against Impunity in relation to the Maguindanao Massacre. The event was spearheaded by the Students Extension of Resources through Voluntary Efforts and participated by student volunteers.

# COMMUNITY EXTENSION PROGRAM

On December 21, 2009, 600 school supplies were distributed to the schoolchildren of Brgy. Malinta during the Lasalyanong Pamasko, a gift-giving project of the University in partnership with Jollibee Foundation.

In coordination with the Municipality of Dasmariñas, a series of meetings and public hearings for the Children's Code were held on February 3, 10, 16, 17 and 24, 2010.

The Lasallian Community Development Center organized a Diocesan Trainers' Training on May Election on March 27, 2010 at DLSU-D. A Voter's Education for Dasmariñas was also conducted at the Immaculate Concepcion Parish, Dasmariñas on April 24, 2010. The Center co-established the May One Commemorative Committee that organized a forum on the National Elections last May 1, 2010 at Imus Pilot Elementary School.

#### *Bahay Pag-asa Dasmariñas*

More than 50 percent of the modules needed for Bahay Pag-asa Dasmariñas were done and will be submitted to the Department of Social Welfare and Development Undersecretary Alicia Bala for her comments and approval. The center has already come up with its operations manual which will be implemented after being evaluated. Colleges and faculty members involved in the Bahay Pag-asa were oriented on August 9, 2009.

The College of Criminal Justice Education received a donation amounting to Php 500,000.00 from the Cavite Mayors League. Classroom 101 shall be named after the League in honor of its support.

# SCHOLARSHIPS AND FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

The University envisions to help less economically privileged but deserving young people to elevate their status through Lasallian education. This thrust fuels constant support from the different benefactors that help DLSU-D realize this dream.

Schoolyear 2009-2010's record of enrolment shows that, during the 1<sup>st</sup> semester, 1,536 out of 12,646 students, or 12.14 percent of the student population, were recipients of the various sources of scholarships. While 1,467 out of 11,879 or 12.35 percent of the enrolled students during the second semester were scholars.

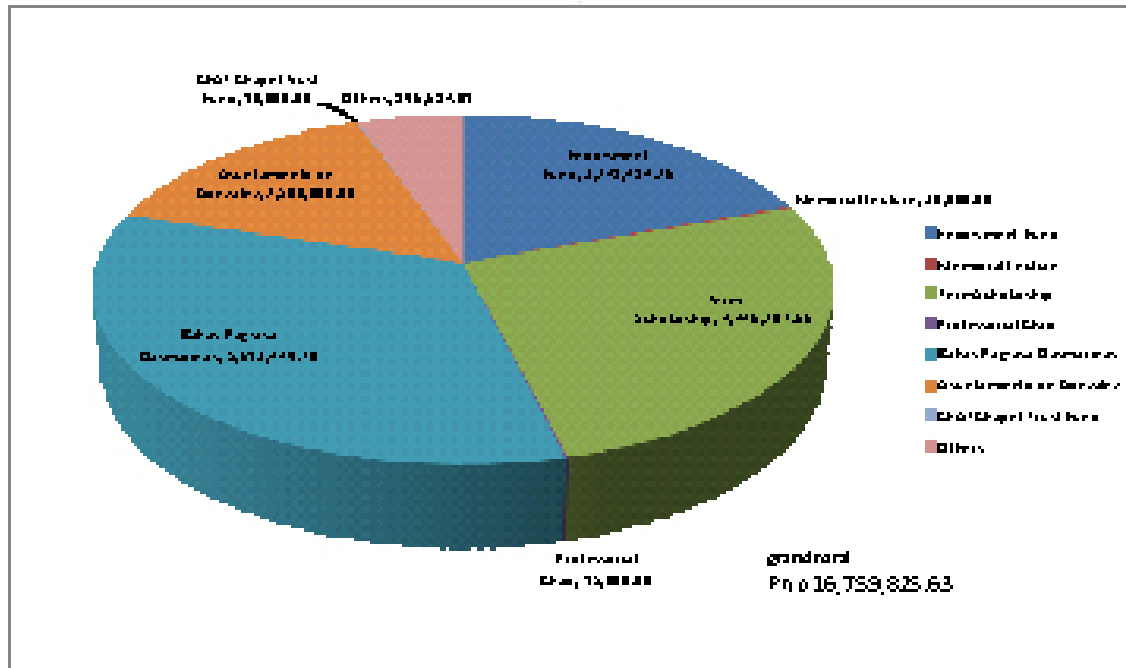

# DONATIONS RECEIVED

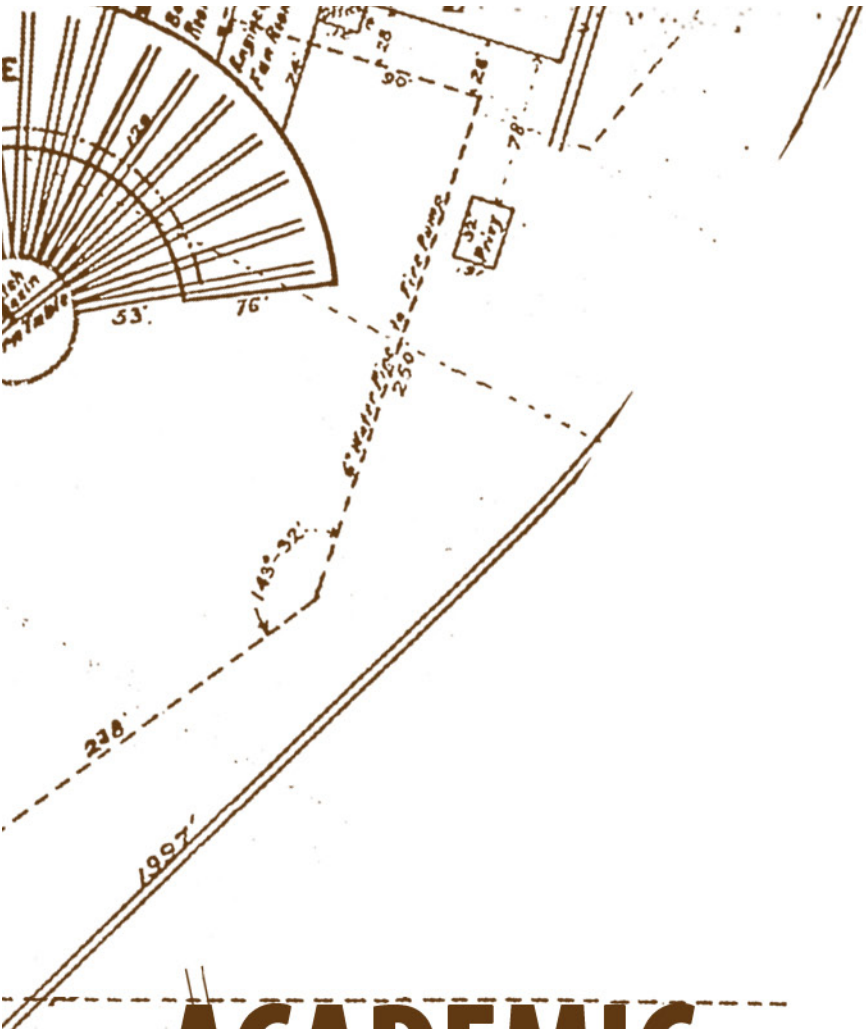
In schoolyear 2009-2010, DLSU-D greatly benefited from the generosity and continuous support of various friends and benefactors. A total of Php 16,759,825.63 in cash were given to the University.

The development projects such as the Ayuntamiento de Gonzalez raised Php 2,500,000.00, Bahay Pag-asa Dasmariñas with Php 5,613,449.70 and the College of Engineering, Architecture and Technology Chapel Fund with Php 10,000.00. For term scholarships, the school received Php 4,446,207.66. Meanwhile, Php 3,248,484.26 were for various endowment funds; Php 896,684.01 for other donations in kind; Php 30,000.00 for memorial lectures; and Php 15,000.00 for professorial chairs.

# ACADEMIC LINKAGES

As DLSU-D perseveres to develop on its own, it continuously seeks ways on how it will commune with the larger community on maximizing what it can do to contribute to a better society. DLSU-D, through its various units, has forged partnership and collaboration with institutions that share its vision in the fields of academic, industrial and community service, both locally and abroad.

This year, new partnerships and better collaboration were made through the signing of Memorandum of Agreement between DLSU-D and the following institutions:

- World Health Organization funding through the Department of Health for the establishment of DLSU-D as a Healthy University model

After years of using the University web address [www.dasma.dlsu.edu.ph](http://www.dasma.dlsu.edu.ph), the Information and Communications Technology Center has bought a new domain name for easier recall: [www.dlsud.edu.ph](http://www.dlsud.edu.ph). Along with this change in domain name comes the modification of the mail addresses which is now [userid@dlsud.edu.ph](mailto:userid@dlsud.edu.ph). The migration of the old application server to the new one was already carried out this school year.

Another major development in this area is the Aklatang Emilio Aguinaldo's acquisition of an e-Beam donated by CE-Logic, Inc. This e-Beam Interactive White Board is a classroom innovation where the user could manipulate the project contents of what is on the computer through this interactive whiteboard. The said e-Beam is already being utilized at the Luis Aguado Viewing Room since September of 2009.

Further improvements in information technology are as follows:

- Inclusion of streaming videos in the official website where the Expected Lasallian Graduate Attribute videos from the Office of the Vice Chancellor for Academics and Research are played
- Installation of additional Wi-fi hotspots at the Severino de las Alas Hall and Julian Felipe Hall (in preparation of the RFID and Biometrics implementation)
- Upgrade of the internet bandwidth from 14MB to 20MB, resulting to a faster internet access and better browsing for the community
- Internet service expansion of major offices

# INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY DEVELOPMENT



Another edifice that bares the mark of DLSU-D as Cavite's premier university rises: The College of International Hospitality Management Building. The CIH Building, inspired by the first hotel in the Philippines known as Hotel de Oriente, started its construction during the schoolyear 2009-2010 and by the end of the same schoolyear, only the finishing touches of the exterior and interior of the College of International Hospitality Management building needs to be done. The building is ready for occupation at the start of SY 2010-2011.

Other key accomplishments in this area are as follows:

- Eighty-six percent (86%) of the Phase I and II of the West Riverbank Rehabilitation Project is done.
- The Phase III of the construction of the Ayuntamiento de Gonzalez is already complete.
- Ninety-five percent (95%) of the construction of Mila's Diner, funded by the concessionaire Mila Cruz, is done and will be operational at the start of SY 2010-2011.
- Twenty-eight percent (28%) of the column works for the extension and an addition of eight laboratory rooms for housekeeping of Hotel Rafael is done.
- The design of the new IT Building which will house ten computer laboratory rooms to replace the existing Mariano Alvarez Hall is being finalized. The proposed project will be funded by the accumulated Internet Fund balance and Development Fee from the Computer Science students. Target date for the start of construction is on September 1, 2010.

# PHYSICAL FACILITIES DEVELOPMENT

The Commission on Higher Education (CHED) recognized DLSU-D as a Center for Development in Computer Studies, Information Technology program.

Through the Lasallian Community Development Center, the University was awarded the SANDUGO Kabalikat Awards for Cavite Blood Council and Department of Health on July 20, 2009.

DLSU-D was adjudged as Best in Materials Recovery Facility in the Province of Cavite.

DLSU-D, through the Information and Communications Technology Center, became a part of the Cavite Information and Communications Technology Council, in cooperation with the Office of the Governor.

The Cavite Studies Center received the Lingkod Caviteño Award (Education and Research) from the provincial Government of Cavite on September 22.

DLSU-D received a special citation award from the De La Salle Alumni Association during the 7<sup>th</sup> World Congress at the Hilton, Los Angeles, Universal City, California, USA, for its successful implementation of the Alumni Database. Moreover, the Alumni Relations and Placement Office University Public Employment Service Office (UPESO) was conferred the “Best Academic-based PESO” by the provincial PESO, in partnership with the Department of Labor and Employment during the “Recognition Night for Employers and Industrial Peace Partners” on November 26, 2009 at the Cavite Provincial Capitol.
