

The process involved in order to cut the cost of producing such developments included mass production methods and specialized teams of workers, which allowed for relatively fast results.



This movement was sparked shortly after World War II when the housing industry was at a financial standstill. The goal of William Levitt was to produce low-cost housing at a low cost rate. William Levitt and his father, Abraham Levitt started this movement of mass-producing houses first by purchasing 1000 acres of land in Long Island, NewYork. Levittown included 17,000 homes. This development highlights a significant transition America made during this time. This movement aided in the suburban sprawl in America during this time as well.
