Patti LaBelle is a renowned R&B/soul singer who created two successful music groups before achieving total success as a solo artist in the late 1970s. LaBelle has influenced a new generation of female singers through her strong vocals and her signature high-octave vocal belting. Her wide vocal range remains unique, and she is regarded as one of the greatest vocal artists of all time. Her metamorphosis throughout the years has been amazing, it has helped her win two grammys and be the first recording artist to receive a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame. She's famous for her hit singles Lady Marmalade, If only you knew, I sold my Heart to the Junkman, and If you ask me to. She was diagnosed with diabetes in 1995. She's the spokeswoman for the American Diabetes Association, and she has published two cookbooks specifically for diabetics, the books' recipes contain low-sugar and low-fat recipes.
