'Salvage' budget in the works for 2013

Capital improvements get careful scrutiny

In terms of capital improvement projects in the 2013 budget, Oak Park will be keeping its belt as tight as possible.

The term "salvage" has been a recurring theme throughout the budget-discussion process in finance committee meetings, and the case was no different Monday night when Public Works Director John Wielebnicki ran through the plan for the upcoming year.

"2013 reflects the deferral of large building improvements," Wielebnicki said, which includes pushing back the building of a gun range and deferring fleet replacement.

In terms of equipment replacement in the village, however, there are a number of initiatives the village plans to tackles, such as updated computer equipment, and mobile
