COMMUNITY FORUM

About 20 East End residents met on the evening of 28 January at Cocolat in Rundle Street to plan how the East End community can be engaged in improving the area and to encourage conversations with each other outside of the meeting. They identified the following three priorities to improve the area:

- Address antisocial behaviors occurring in public realm mainly related to overconsumption of alcohol
- Improve litter management on footpaths especially during events and on weekends
- 3. Address noise from entertainment

venues, events and street performers especially bongo drummers.

The boundaries of what is known as the East End are marked by the following streets: Grenfell Street, East Terrace, North Terrace and Pulteney Street.

The Adelaide City Council Rapid Response team are on call to respond to the following issues:

- Construction and maintenance defects
- Illegally dumped hard refuse / rubbish
- Damaged bins, street furniture, bike racks etc.
- Butt out bin or litter bins on fire
- Syringe needle sightings
- Vomit, oil spills and stains
- Broken glass on footpaths and roads
- Uplifted pavers, small pot holes
- Broken signs, tree branches on footpaths and roads
- Missing catchpit grates, covers
- Cleaning up glass on footpaths from broken windows in buildings

- Damaged, bent and stolen bollards and posts
- Removal of offensive posters.
