Registration is required. EPL cardholders may register at any time until the beginning of class or until the class is filled (whichever comes first). If a class is not full seven days prior, registration will open to non-EPL cardholders.

The library reserves the right to cancel a computer class due to insufficient enrollment (fewer than five students). If the library cancels a class, students will be notified at least 48 hours in advance. The class will either be rescheduled, or students will receive a voucher for a future class.

**Non-cardholders: \$15**

Fees must be paid by cash or check.

If a student must cancel, at least seven days notice is required. The student will either be rescheduled or given a class voucher at that time. Vouchers are good for six months. **Refunds will not be given.**
