- Provide 70% of children in China with 2 years of preschool & kindergarten
- Enroll 40,000,000 children in preschool, a 50% increase in 2012
- Graduate 95% of Chinese youths through 9 years of compulsory education
- Ensure that no child drops out of school for financial reasons
- More than double enrollment in higher education
- Double the share of the working-age population that completes higher education to 195,000,000 workers, more than the entire U.S. labor force.

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By 2030, China is expected to have up to 200,000,000 college graduates, more than the entire workforce of the USA.

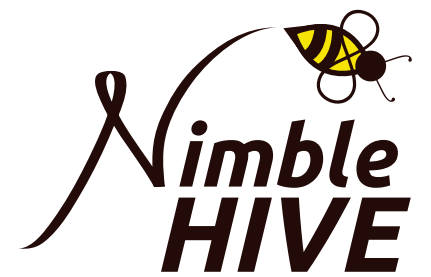
4,000,000 young adults a year are enrolled in **PRACTITIONING ENGINEER** training in 2-4 year technical & vocational programs.

China schools now have **ENGLISH** language as **REQUIRED STUDY**

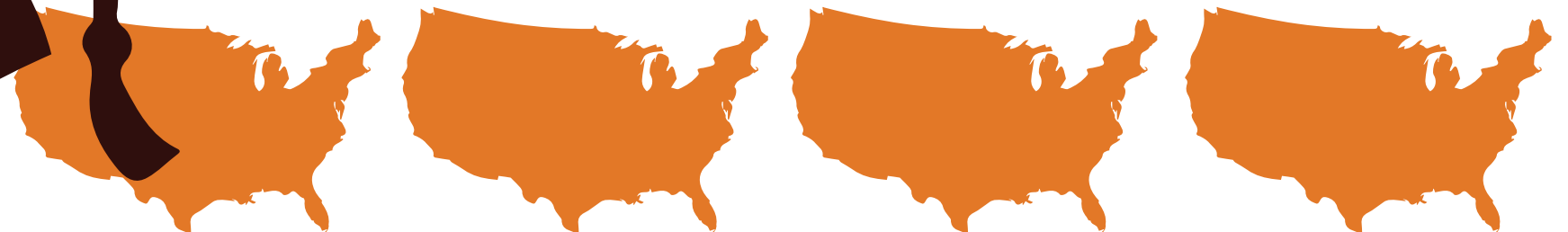
