UNDER 1000 DOLLARS

It was just five years ago that Canon introduced the original EOS Digital Rebel, which became the first digital SLR to sell for less than \$1,000. That was a gigantic breakthrough, and today there are more than a dozen models selling for less than that, including some models selling for half the price.

Here are three new models to fall under the \$1,000 mark, and the best part about these new models is that they're very capable cameras, delivering excellent image quality and performance and providing a host of versatile features found in pro-level D-SLRs.

CANON REBEL XSi

The EOS Rebel XSi is the fourth generation of the original price barrier-busting EOS Digital Rebel. Despite its very compact size and low price, the 12.2-megapixel XSi sports a number of features found in Canon's pro D-SLRs, including a 3.0-inch LCD monitor, a Live-View mode, the EOS Integrated Cleaning System to keep dust off the image sensor, the DIGIC III image processor, 14-bit A/D conversion (which can provide 16,384 gradations, as opposed to 4,096 for 12-bit images), E-TTL flash control, various Picture Styles and more.
