Meteorite

Ancient iron from the heavens can occasionally be heated and shaped. This ring collection was born from several years of experimentation and has evolved from a complicated manufacturing process to a streamlined marriage of powerful forging and delicate goldsmithing. My meteorite rings feature high karat golds and platinum which are expertly combined with meteorite iron to make handmade wedding treasures.



ur meteorite rings are made exclusively from pieces of the Gibeon Meteorite found in Namibia. The Gibeon flamed into our atmosphere as a visible star-like streak an estimated 3,000 years ago. The extreme slow-cooling of its trip through deep space created an original crystalline that has no equal here on earth.

Though "officially" discovered in the desert 1838, local craftsmen made spear points and other tools out of the fragments for many years prior to this. The metal of the meteorite is estimated to be four and a half billion years old, and today it is a rare commodity.

Not all Gibeon Meteorite frag-

ments are of equal quality. For every piece of meteorite that is suitable for use in jewelry, I reject many others. Much of the meteorite has suffered deep fractures and inclusions on its travels to our planet, and many pieces have lain exposed to the elements for several thousand years. I use only the best quality meteorite for making rings. Due to its composition, the Gibeon meteorite is naturally stain and rust resistant.

We cut, forge and fabricate the meteorite and combine it with precious metals and stones to make extremely unique, strong and beautiful jewelry.

Our rings are made to order with quick delivery times and
