HIKING SWAZILAND PRESENTS: SIBEBE

An exhilarating hike through prehistoric Swaziland to mythical underwater gardens

Sibebe Rock is an ancient outcrop of granite found in Pine Valley, Swaziland. We start the hike by appreciating the elevation of 1200m and a history 2.6 million years, by going up the side of this incredible example of prehistoric rock formation – it is steep!

Once up on the plateau, you can enjoy the stunning view of the Mbuluzi River and the ragged mountain range, Mahlokohlo, that stretches across the Pine Valley skyline. And we reach The Underwater Garden. An opportunity to cool off after this challenging hike up the mountain. Or if swimming is not your first choice of relaxation, take in the beautiful sight of the crystal clear water that holds the perfect ethereal garden.

From the plateau, you get a chance to explore the tunnels, crevasses enormous boulders, valleys and streams. All amazing feats of nature recreating itself over billions of years.

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HIKING SWAZILAND PRESENTS: **THE GAP** + SWAZI CULTURE

An introduction to traditional cultural Swazi life. An interpretation of Swazilands oldest rock art, and a visual spectacle of rock and river formation.

The meeting point is at Maguga Lodge. Here you will be introduced to BabeMnisi where he will then lead you to his homestead. You will be given a tour of his family home, a chance to see authentic Swazi culture.

The hike then leaves the homestead and follows the route along the south bank of the Nkomati river, walking through lush growth with a canopy of wild fig trees. Bird-life enthusiasts will find this walk very rewarding, with its changing landscapes and numerous different bird species. For the strenuous ascents, you are rewarded with the amazing Nsangwini Rock Art, the most diverse known to date.

The descent back down towards the Nkomati River begins. Crossing over on a suspension bridge, the great river full of rounded boulders and pebble beds, you head towards the final scene of historical Swaziland. The Gap - where the large Komati River disappears down a meter width channel. An amazing spectacle of potholes, rock sculptures and channels carved out by millions of years of water flow. A full days hike through a part of ancient Swaziland.

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
