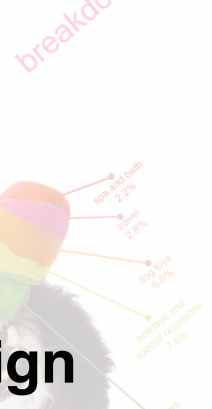

### Producing a Body of Knowledge from Design-Led Research

**Scope:** Cornell University's InTypes Interior Architecture Research and Teaching Project identifies and catalogs examples of historical and culturally determined practices of contemporary practice that have not been named and generates a design-specific vocabulary, and a new knowledge base from practice-led research.

**Audience:** Users include designers, architects, preservationists, faculty and students, industry researchers, trade publishers, editors, manufacturers/vendors, dealers, the public, the press.

**Significance:** In five years the web site will express the practice of interior design to the public by supplying an unprecedented catalog of digital images of published work. InTypes encourages designers and students to link history and contemporary design using a structured, robust, and accessible method.

**Fit Out:** Research will be disseminated through an open, accessible web database—[intypes.cornell.edu](http://intypes.cornell.edu). The Project will be launched at **IntCon** in June 2009 by founding partners, the International Interior Design Association (IIDA) and Interior Design.
