A crowd of more than 50 gathered at Russell and Jefferson on that blustery afternoon and heard Ameren CEO Tom Voss and St. Louis Mayor Francis Slay speak passionately about SouthSide's mission and the wonderful legacy created by the building of our new school.

SouthSide has Youth Opportunity Progam (YOP) Tax Credits

Missouri YOP Tax Credits enable you to give twice as much with less out-of-pocket cost!

For a donation of \$500 or more to SouthSide Early Childhood Center, you can receive a 50% Missouri State Tax credit against any Missouri taxes you owe. Combined with federal and state charitable deductions, you could receive a significant amount back on your donation.

A donation of \$6,000 provides a year of service to a child and family at SouthSide. With no additional cost to you, you can double that gift to \$12,000, take advantage of the tax credit, and transform the lives of two children and their families.

Who is Eligible?

Any entity or individual with a Missouri income tax liability may receive a tax credit. This includes Individuals, Corporations, Partnerships, S Corps and LLCs.

Eligible Contribution

Contributions to SouthSide of \$500 or more in cash or stock until June 30, 2015.

How the tax credits work:

As with most charitable donations, the donor may claim a federal income tax deduction. With Missouri Tax Credits, the donor may also take a 50% state tax credit against state taxes owed. Donors have up to five years to utilize all of the credits. In addition, with gifts of stock, the donor owes no capital gains tax on any appreciation. As with any gift, how much is deductible for tax purposes will depend upon the donor's unique financial circumstances. Please consult your tax advisor.

In 2012 more than 95 individual volunteers and 15 corporate/organization/student groups volunteered at SouthSide.

More than 960 hours of service were provided, which saved the organization \$12,650 in real dollars. Volunteers provided administrative and teaching assistance, as well as maintenance, cleaning, sorting and painting projects both inside and on the exterior grounds of the school.

289 hours of the work provided was through the 38 eighth grade student volunteers of St. Gabriel the Archangel School. For many years, the St. Gabriel students have volunteered at SouthSide, contributing more than 3,000 hours of service in the classrooms. They are funny, helpful and patient and always show the greatest respect for our children and teachers.

This year the St. Gabriel students were honored at our 2013 gala. We look forward to having them volunteer again and appreciate the work all of our volunteers contribute to SouthSide each year.

outhside has been committed to children and families of St. Louis City since 1886, making us the oldest early childhood education provider in the Midwest. During those long 127 years, we have operated in just two facilities. The first was demolished for Highway 55 so we moved into our current facility on Iowa Avenue in 1954.

Thousands of children and families later, in 2011 we set our sights to building a new school. Because a child's environment impacts the expectations of his or her life, we wanted SouthSide children to experience their early years in a place that matched the quality of our program.

With a tremendous amount of hope, we launched the Nurture, Educate & Inspire Campaign. It is a thrill to report that thanks to the generosity of individuals, companies, foundations and tax credits, including New Markets Tax Credits and Missouri Neighborhood Assistance Program Tax Credits, the children will greet their beautiful new school on Jefferson Avenue, just south of Highway 44, in the 2014 academic year.

The 19,000 square foot building will allow us to welcome many more girls and boys to benefit from quality early education, establishing a foundation that will last their lifetimes.

As we enter the construction period this August, we eagerly seek an additional \$250,000 to provide the best of the best for the children, so there is still plenty of time to be part of this historic moment!

A New Building Opens Doors to New Learning Opportunities!
