his smart, compact apartment is the New York equivalent to a crow's nest, overlooking a busy commuter street in uptown Manhattan. In an eminently desirable and lively city such as this, where living space is at a premium, clever

design is key.

Here, the limited space available has been

ingeniously adapted to make use of every square foot. What appears at first glance to be a wall is, in fact, a row of large walk-in closets. The kitchen, too, is no more than a small

cupboard cleverly designed to incorporate all you need to cook and entertain. Even the study is hidden behind a double-height door leading off the main sitting area. Adjustable and foldaway furniture, such as the dining table, allows the freedom of choosing to utilize the space for specific purposes.

One-Color Calm

Throughout the apartment, monochrome décor has been used to promote a feeling of calm and order. In addition, the masculine black upholstery acts as an interior slimming aid, making the furniture in the living area appear less dominant.
