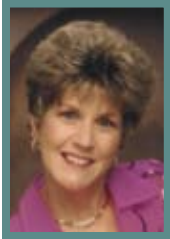

Beth Peshman, RDH

After her hygiene education at Marquette University, Beth became involved in the "prevention revolution" of the 1970's, participating in courses and forums sponsored by the Society for Preventive Dentistry. Early in her career, Beth found the dentist with whom she wanted to work, a prosthodontist in Phoenix, AZ.

Since most prosthodontists don't need a full time hygienist, Beth split her time between clinical hygiene and practice management. Through the 1980's, as root form implants were introduced to the US, Beth and the rest of the team followed the doctor's lead, learning about implants and providing innovative services to their patients. The dramatic quality of life improvements that Beth observed sparked the idea for her "second" career. One of the vexations Beth experienced was the lack of evidence to help her in long-term implant maintenance. Literature available to hygienists is limited and reliance on sales presentations didn't seem an adequate basis for practice norms. This frustration led to the development of her hygiene updates. Since 2000, she has presented hundreds of programs about implants to thousands of dentists and staff all over the US and Canada.

Dental Implant Team Day: Immediate Load and Temporization

Description

This course is designed for experienced clinicians and implant teams wishing to introduce or expand immediate procedures within their implant practices. The biologic basis and current evidence for accelerated placement and loading protocols will be discussed. Restorative considerations to be detailed include diagnostic procedures, template fabrication, radiographic assessment, provisional restoration procedures, cement and screw-retained prosthodontic alternatives, and follow-up protocols. The esthetic and functional advantages and disadvantages of these procedures will also be discussed along with treatment risk analysis.
