States General hindered the importation of French paper in 1671 because they feared they might have to shut down their publishing center due to long papermaking. Being the first to have the idea of woving paper without wires or chain lines, John Baskerville helped increase the numbers of paper mills and trade during the suffering in the 1720's.

During the 1750's, the increase of paper mills raised the use of the printing presses and papers. While working at the Cambridge University Press, Baskerville published one of his first works, The Virgil, and then six years later he published his masterwork, Folio Bible. John used his own paper, ink, and typeface in his Folio Bible. His books were one of the greatest that was printed.
