


Integration of the site with our proposed building renders a collaboration at different scales of the programs on site. The rearrangement of roads and replacement of individual buildings with one large complex improves the efficiency of circulation and goods movement. The building itself houses an intricate yet straightforward system of circulation serving employees, management, and visitors.

Trucks have direct access to both the intermediate market building and the market tower through a series of underground roads that connect program spaces with loading docks and parking.

Directly from parking and loading, people may enter the towers through vertical cores that span across the many programs beginning with the nexus of the complex. This space serves as the ground level entry, visitors' center, and space for retail along the periphery of the building. The volume of the nexus extends beyond the edge of the building to reach to other parts of the site and provide needed outdoor space.
