# Exploring the "End of the Earth"

While sailing toward Indonesia's fabled Spice Islands in 1520, Portuguese explorer Ferdinand Magellan discovered what would later become known as the Strait of Magellan. Along the south side of the strait, amid the world's southernmost forests, smoke rose from numerous native Selk'nam campfires, and so

Magellan initially named this island


Tierra del Humo, "land of smoke," which Spain's King Charles V changed to the more poetic Tierra del Fuego, "land of fire." The northern side came to be known as Patagonia, "land of giants," for the mythically tall indigenous inhabitants Magellan and his men encountered. Three centuries later, HMS Beagle became the first ship to completely sail east to west through its namesake channel, which separates the main island of Tierra del Fuego from the smaller islands that stretch down to Cape Horn. This was the Beagle's second voyage to Patagonia, now under the command of Admiral Robert FitzRoy and with young naturalist Charles Darwin on board. You can experience the same wonderment of these intrepid explorers as you cruise through these mesmerizing landscapes that still look much as they did when Magellan discovered them nearly 500 years ago. So as not to spoil Patagonia's unsurpassed beauty, the m.v. VIA AUSTRALIS is fitted with the latest technology to meet environmental regulations and leave minimal impact on the navigation routes. Your crew and naturalist guides ensure that the group's carbon footprint is neutral, both on board and ashore.

## Santiago, Chile

Experience Santiago, Chile's vibrant and modern capital in the foothills of the snowcapped Andes Mountains. Tour the highlights of the city's native and traditional European-influenced architecture and culture. Visit the outstanding collections in the Museum of Pre-Columbian Art. Take in the stunning views of the city and surrounding mountains from atop San Cristóbal Hill. ## Punta Arenas

The capital of Chile's Magallanes province, historic Punta Arenas is the southernmost continental city in the world, overlooking the Strait of Magellan, and is the gateway to Patagonia and the Antarctic. During a city tour, admire the Napoleonic architecture and 19<sup>th</sup>-century mansions lining the Plaza de Armas.

## Puerto Natales

Unfolding before you as you journey into the heart of Patagonia is a vast horizon and rugged, beautiful countryside against a backdrop of snowcapped mountains,

where sheep, guanacos and the endangered lesser rhea roam.

Originally inhabited by the Tehuelche people for thousands of years, the town of Puerto Natales later served as a major transit point for the sheep and coal industries of 20<sup>th</sup>-century Patagonia. Absorb the beauty and charms of this region at the Hostería Estancia Río Penitente Patagonian sheep ranch, today a preserved Victorian farmhouse owned by descendants of Scottish pioneers. Here, enjoy a traditional lunch and sheep herding demonstration.

Monumental buildings like the Argentine Congress reflect late 19<sup>th</sup>- and early 20<sup>th</sup>-century economic growth of Buenos Aires.

Nearby in Milodón Cave, 1890s German pioneer Herman Eberhard discovered the prehistoric remains of a 13-foot giant sloth.

## Torres del Paine National Park

South America's finest national park and National Geographic's fifth most beautiful place in the world, this UNESCO Biosphere Reserve is a majestic jewel. Torres del Paine is a pristine reservoir of magnificent glaciers, lakes, dramatic mountain ranges and an abundance of distinctive wildlife—ostrich-like rheas, pumas, the endangered South Andean deer and guanacos, the predecessor to llamas and alpacas. From the shores of Grey Lake, admire the inspiring views of the Torres del Paine Massif and Grey Glacier. Enjoy lunch in the park with spectacular views of its signature massive, three-peaked Cordillera Paine mountaintops.

## Cruising the Chilean Fjords

On board the small expedition ship m.v. Via AUSTRALIS, cruise the channels and straits of Tierra del Fuego, formed by the southern end of the great Andes mountain range. Amid amazing scenery, observe up close vivid blue tidewater glaciers and see a vast array of wildlife, including elephant seals, cormorants, skua birds and Magellanic penguins.

Located in the lesser known Alberto de Agostini National Park, the coastal inlet **Ainsworth Bay** is fed by the retreating tidewater Marinelli Glacier and is home to a colony of elephant seals. In a Zodiac craft, make a landing on the shores to walk among the broadleaf trees in the subpolar Magellanic forest and to see the dramatic environmental effects of tens of thousands of beavers, descendants of the original 20 that were imported from North America in 1946. During a Zodiac excursion in neighboring Admiralty Sound, observe the unusual bird species on Tucker Islet,

including rock cormorants, dolphin gulls, Magellanic penguins and chimango caracaras.

Cruise **Beagle Channel**, named for Darwin's ship, which twice explored these waters in the mid-19<sup>th</sup> century. Make a Zodiac landing and walk to a magnificent vantage point to see the tidewater Pia Glacier calve into the fjord. A highlight of the channel is the spectacular cruise through the grand **Glacier Alley**, a majestic wonderland of hanging and tidewater glaciers, swaths of blue ice flowing from the towering gray mountains of the Darwin Range.

**Cape Horn**, a UNESCO Biosphere Reserve, has a history that demands reverence for nature's power. Take a Zodiac craft ashore for a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to stand at the "edge of the world" overlooking legendary Drake Passage, weather permitting. Walk across the low-lying, fragile tundra vegetation for an unmatched panoramic view of ships passing around the tip of the New World between the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans.

Cruise into **Wulaia Bay**, and make a Zodiac landing on Isla Navarino. Birdlife, including the unusual Magellanic oystercatcher, is abundant along the shore, while a hike through a Magellanic forest to 700 feet above sea level offers a spectacular view of the bay.

*Magdalena Island in the Strait of Magellan has been designated a national nature reserve as an important Magellanic penguin breeding site.*

Visit the former outpost of the Chilean Navy, which now houses exhibits on past explorers and the indigenous Yámana peoples.

### Buenos Aires, Argentina

Known as the birthplace of the tango, elegant Buenos Aires consists of diverse *barrios* (neighborhoods), which include the colorful La Boca district, Monserrat's historic Plaza de Mayo and grand public buildings, Palermo's lavish parks, Puerto Madero's riverfront community and the charming old quarter of San Telmo. The city's historic Recoleta Cemetery is famous for its ornate vaults and sculptures and as the final resting place of the legendary Evita Perón, the former First Lady of Argentina.

### Engaging Experts On Board

Seasoned expert naturalists, who have studied and traveled extensively in this remote region of the world, will travel with you aboard the m.v. **VIA AUSTRALIS** and provide lectures and presentations on glaciology in Patagonia, discovering Tierra del Fuego, survival of the native Indians in the region and Sir Ernest Shackleton's Antarctic adventures. The team's collaborative experience and enthusiasm for sharing their knowledge make them exceptionally well-suited to lead your cruise through Patagonia's Chilean fjords.





## M.V. VIA AUSTRALIS

The m.v. Via Australis is designed specifically for cruising the waters of Southern Patagonia—Chile's spectacular glacier-studded fjords and Argentina's striking Tierra del Fuego. This expedition ship can cruise into remote fjords, ports and secluded inlets inaccessible to larger vessels and provides guests with the intimacy and personal service only a small cruise ship can offer.

Each of the 64 ocean-view cabins features a large picture window, one double bed or two twin beds, private bathroom with shower, individual climate control, safe and hair dryer.

A team of multilingual expert naturalists will share their in-depth knowledge about the region's history, natural wonders and wildlife. The ship is equipped with Zodiac landing craft for excursions.

The ship's inviting Patagonia Dining Room offers international and Patagonian specialties amid magnificent panoramic views. Early-risers' coffee, buffet breakfast, buffet lunch, afternoon tea and dinner are served daily in single, unassigned seatings. Complimentary regional wine and beer are served with lunch and dinner.

The comfortable public areas are tastefully appointed and include the panoramic Sky Lounge, an observation deck, two bars, a gift shop and the spacious Yámana Lounge, which features a library and a game room.

The ship maintains the highest international safety standards and is fitted with the latest technology to meet environmental regulations and leave minimal impact on the navigation routes.



## **Easter Island** Pre-Program Option

The UNESCO World Heritage site of Easter Island and its unique archaeological treasures are shrouded in mystery. Centuries ago, people settled on this tiny island, a mere 64-square-mile speck amid the vast Pacific Ocean, more than 1200 miles from any other inhabited land. Many questions remain as to how and when they arrived here and why they sculpted the hundreds of gigantic stone *moai* placed across the island. Unearth the enigmatic ancient culture and meet the friendly present-day residents of this solitary island. Visit its most important sites, including the basalt quarry from which the *moai* were carved and where many incomplete sculptures still lie, the white-sand beach said to be the landing site of the island's first settler, and the village central to the curious ceremonial Birdman culture, predominant until the arrival of Christian missionaries. Enjoy accommodations for three nights in the deluxe HOTEL HANGAROA featuring spectacular views of the Pacific Ocean.


