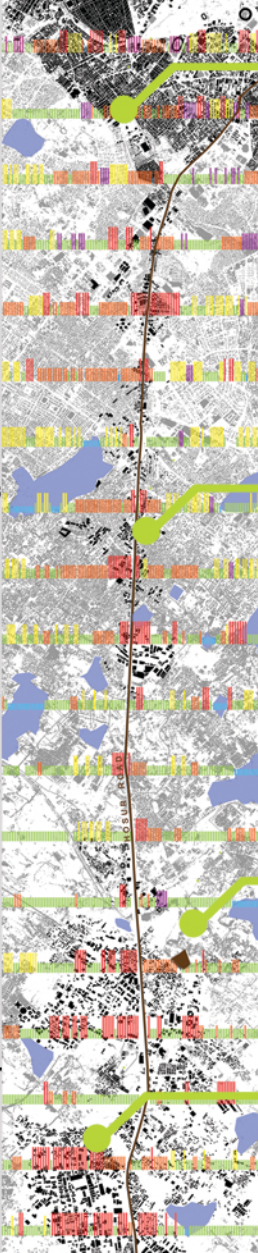


THE SITE

BANGALORE, also known as Bengalūru, is the capital of the south Indian state of Karnataka. Known as the **SILICON VALLEY OF INDIA**, it is one of the fastest growing cities in the country and a principle node in a **GLOBAL INFORMATION and COMMUNICATIONS** production and consumption network. During the initial weeks of the semester, mapping exercises were carried out to analyze the urban periphery along Hosur Road that leads from the **HISTORIC URBAN CORE** to **ELECTRONIC CITY**, a principle node in a new network of IT development that has transformed India's economy and Bangalore's urban structure. An appropriate site for a proposed information technology park was then selected based on various parameters suitable for the purpose.

THE MASTERPLAN

The site of the Technology Park is about **18 ACRES** located in the close proximity of Electronic City phase II. On the south east corner of the site is a natural water tank, and a smaller tank on the north-west corner. Many of these tanks scattered all along the city, are an important **WATER RESOURCE** of the city. The site is also surrounded with villages and the proposed master plan is designed to cater both, the new technology companies and the native villagers.



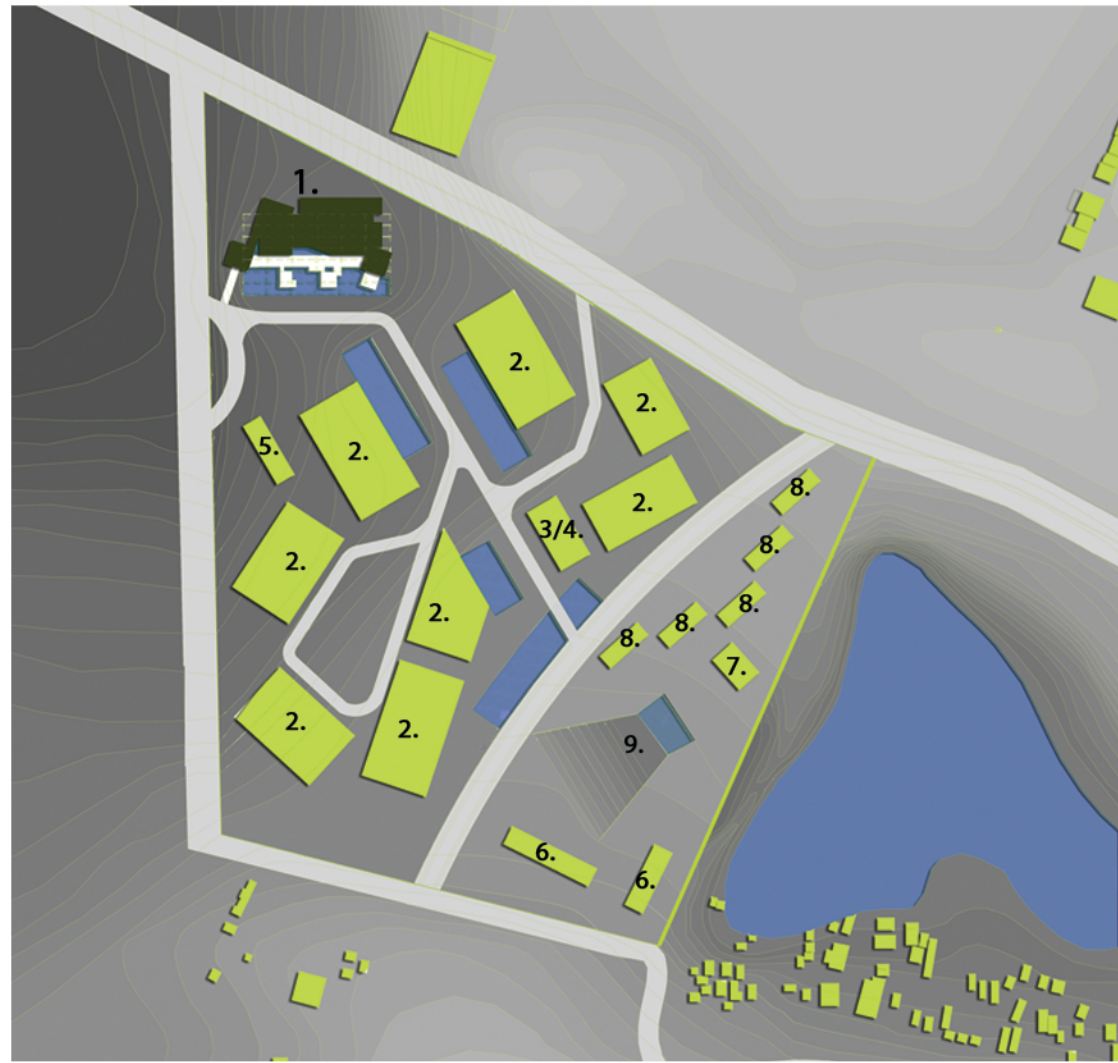
