1 APPLY TO UVU Complete the online application at www.uvu.edu/admissions and pay the application fee. It will take two business days to process the application. You will then receive an e-mail confirming your admission to UVU and providing you with your UV ID. The Admissions deadline is August 15 for Fall semester and December 20 for Spring semester. \$100 late fee assessed after deadline, through the first day of semester. No applications will be accepted after first day of semester.

2 COMPLETE WEBSTART PRE-ADVISEMENT Go to www.uvu.edu and click on *UVlink*. The first time you log on to *UVlink*, your password will be your birthday (mmddyy).

- a. Click "Webstart" and begin the pre-advisement session. This will take about 20 minutes to complete.
- b. Print out your completion certificate and bring it to the meeting your advisor.

3 SUBMIT ACT OR SAT SCORES AND OFFICIAL HIGH SCHOOL TRANSCRIPT ACT or SAT test scores are required for all students under age 21 who have not completed 15 or more university credits. Send official test scores and transcript materials to the Admissions Office. Placement testing will be needed if:

- a. ACT/SAT scores are expired: Math scores must be less than two years old and english/reading scores must be less than three.
- b. Student older than 21 is entering UVU as a first-time university student.
- c. ACT english/reading: under 10, ACT math: under 19, SAT verbal: under 450, SAT math: Under 500.

Placement testing is offered in Testing Services located at 1165 W. 800 S. in the Wolverine Service Center room 101. The test is given on a walk-in basis. Hours include MWTH 8-4, TU 8-6 and F 8-3. To test, you must bring in a non-expired photo ID. ACT-R testing is offered on a weekly basis on Thursdays at 8:30 am. Pre-registration, including payment of \$35 cash, is required. 4 REGISTER FOR ORIENTATION Orientation events are designed to make your transition to university life a success and to introduce you to the many services, programs, and other resources available at UVU. To learn more and to register for orientation, visit www.uvu.edu/orientation.

5 MEET WITH YOUR ACADEMIC ADVISOR After completing the above steps, meet with your advisor to get personalized help and be cleared for registration. If you need help locating your advisor, go to the UVU home page and click on "Find My Advisor" or call (801) 863-4636.

6 REGISTER FOR CLASSES Log onto *UVlink*. Select "Registration" menu, then click "Look up classes to add." For questions regarding registration call One Stop at (801) 863-4636. Fall registration opens mid-April. Spring registration opens early November.

7 PAY TUITION To access UVU's online payment services, log on to *UVlink* and locate the "tuition payment" box under the "student" tab. Important payment deadlines and purge dates may be found on the student semester timetable located at www.uvu.edu/schedule.

FINANCIAL AID AND SCHOLARSHIPS Apply for scholarships at www.uvu.edu/financialaid/scholarships. Apply for federal and state aid in three steps: (1) Obtain a PIN at www.pin.ed.gov (2) Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.gov (3) Check UVLink for your financial aid status and to read important e-mail notices. Financial Aid (801) 863-8442; Scholarships (801) 863-8443.

TEXTBOOKS Purchase textbooks online through *UVlink*. Locate the “Book Match” box under the “Student” tab or visit the UVU Bookstore in the **Sorensen Student Center**.

ID CARD After you have registered and paid tuition, get a UV OneCard/UV PlusCard at Campus Connection, located in the Sorensen Student Center. Your UVOneCard/UV PlusCard gives you access to the UVU library, athletic events, student activities, computer labs and a 5 percent discount at UVU Dining Services. Activate your UTA Bus Pass for \$20 or for free if you get a UV PlusCard.

PARKING PERMITS Permits are required to park on campus and can be obtained online through *UVlink* or by visiting **One Stop** or **Parking Services**. Must show a current vehicle registration to purchase permit.
