
PROJECT CYPTIA: The Conflict

The Cyptians posess an organ called a Memori. It's function involves sucking in water molecules from the atmosphere, bringing them into the thermal atrium where they are boiled into steam and then sent through veins into the main brain. This organ's collective feature aids in their long term memory process, but presents some serious health risks.
