Role of the Volunteer



Silverleaf volunteers provide many services to victims of sexual abuse and sexual assault. Some of the services include:

- Crisis line coverage
- Assist victims at the hospital and/or police station
- Respond to victim's questions and their non-offending family members and friends
- Provide accurate information about legal and medical procedures
- Safeguard the dignity and rights of the victim
- Provide administrative assistance to staff
- Assist with special events and fundraising efforts
- Assist with community awareness and educational opportunities

Volunteer Requirements

In order to volunteer for rape crisis services, you must be at least 20 years of age, free from any felony convictions, and complete the volunteer process (application, interview and training). If these specifications apply to you, and you have a willingness to volunteer and make a difference in someone's life, then you could be a Silverleaf volunteer.
