Complete the Halloween mad lib for a chance to win a prize. Whether it's silly or scary, feel free to be creative!



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



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### BILL'S STORY (REHAB AWARENESS)

Imagine waking up in the middle of the night to use the bathroom and the left side of your body feels numb and weak. You get up anyway, but your left leg can't support you and you fall. Luckily, your family is able to call for help. You are rushed to San Mateo Medical Center and admitted to the Intensive Care Unit.

This happened to Bill this past June. Bill, age 50, suffered a stroke and was having difficulty speaking, swallowing, moving his left arm and leg, sitting up, dressing himself, standing and walking. It took a team of rehabilitation professionals nearly two months working with Bill to get him strong and independent enough to return home.

Speech therapy worked with Bill to improve swallowing, memory, and speech clarity. Occupational therapy helped Bill learn new strategies to get dressed, shower, and strengthen his left arm. Physical therapy taught Bill how to stand, balance, and walk again. In fact, Bill was one of the first patients to get to

use our brand new LiteGait machine for practicing walking, balancing, jumping, side-stepping, turning, and strengthening exercises in a safe, controlled environment. Throughout his stay, Bill also participated in Creative Arts and Recreation Therapies (CART) groups, which give patients opportunities to engage and participate in a variety of activities like ceramics, tai chi exercise, games, and mindfulness meditation.

The week of September 20th was National Rehabilitation Awareness week.

SMMC offers a full spectrum of inpatient and outpatient rehabilitation services including: creative arts and recreation therapy, occupational therapy, physical therapy, speech therapy, and audiology. We're proud to serve the San Mateo community, and are especially proud of helping individuals like Bill. 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### WHAT'S WITH ALL THE SURVEYS AT SMMC?

It's always nice when someone asks for your opinion. It indicates they care about what you think and they assume you'll have good suggestions on how to improve. That holds true for the staff surveys we conduct at SMMC. The leadership team has identified Staff Engagement as a goal for a reason: they want every provider and every staff person to thrive in their career.

### Feedback Leads to Improvement

The SMMC Executive Team reads all the comments (sometimes more than 700!) from the annual staff surveys. Every leader receives a report on the survey results for their area. And, organization-wide results are provided to all staff via e-mail, the newsletter, and employee forums.

### Through the surveys, staff and providers have shared valuable feedback leading to numerous improvement efforts at SMMC including:

- New recognition program
- Changes to the staff newsletter
- More employee forums
- Coaching and mentoring training for leaders
- Upgraded/new computers
- New equipment (for staff and for patients)
- New SAFE incident reporting system (for patient safety)

When: Bi-Annually, March

Why: Find out how staff view patient safety at SMMC.

How: All SMMC employees and contracted staff receive a link to an

online survey.



## SMMC Pulse Survey (New!)

When: Quarterly

Why: Provides the Executive Team a quick snapshot of how improve-

ment work is progressing.

How: A link to SMMC's first Pulse Survey was e-mailed to all employees in September. Future Pulse Surveys will be sent to a random group of employees each quarter. Every employee will be asked to complete

one Pulse Survey per year.
