A star-shaped figure (*) used chiefly to indicate an omission, a reference to a footnote, or an unattested word or sound.

History of the Asterisk
Originally using six arms, it is now more commonly designed with five. It is a mark most often used to denote a side note and has been in continuous use as a graphic symbol for at least 5,000 years.

Using the Asterisk
Most often used as a superscripted glyph, the asterisk is primarily used for notes, references or to mark a keyword. It can also be used to indicate a person's birth when appearing with a year—with the dagger indicating death.
