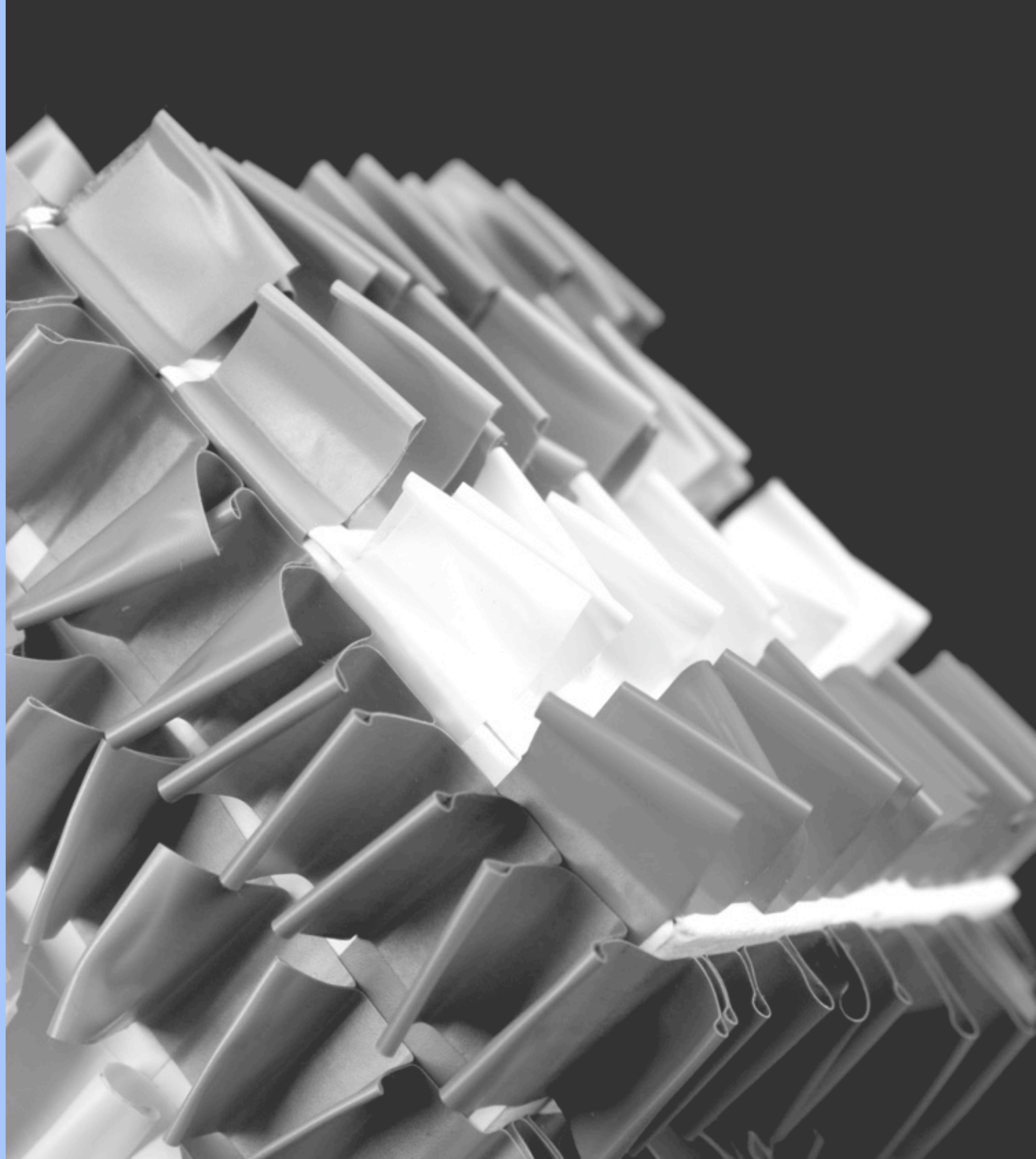


THE CUBE PROJECT
