85 West Sports Bar and Grill ●

85 West St., 212-266-6128; nymarriottdowntown.com.

Located on the ground floor of the Marriott Hotel Downtown, this colorful bar screams sports. A 120" HD projection TV and 16 large HD LCD TVs accompany a classic bar grub, sushi selections and a fine dining menu. Choose from eight beers on tap and a fun martini list in honor of eight New York sports teams or five signature cocktails named for the five boroughs. Plus, on game day there are 100-ounce and 50-ounce beer tubes in which to enjoy your favorite suds. Game day also guarantees great food deals on nachos and wings. Reservations are welcome and there is plenty of space for a large group.



The Bailey Pub and Brasserie ●

The Bailey's sophisticated pub atmosphere has become a popular spot to watch rugby. Enjoy a drink and watch on the large projector screen. Aside from delicious food, the bartenders are extremely friendly and good at what they do. Purse hooks? Yes!



Beckett's Bar and Grill ●

Mudville 9 ●

Established in 1977, Mudville 9 is a classic. Since the late '80s it has offered amazing, perfectly crisp wings with just the right amount of sauce (choose from 11 flavors). The wings were recently highlighted on the Cooking Channel. Even more, they are a perfect accompaniment to 160-plus beers, including several interesting craft beers (30 on tap and more than 130 bottled). This locale offers nine TVs and has plenty of seating. Reservations are recommended.



The Irish American Pub and Restaurant ●

Grab a comfortable leather booth or seat at the roomy bar while watching one of the 12 (soon to be 15) TVs. Pair one of 30 draft beers (29 of which are craft beers) or one of the 30 different bottled beers with classic Irish pub food or regular bar fare.



Warren 77 ●

This locale is perfect for watching a big game in upscale ambience. As one of the regulars said, "It's a great place to take a girl on a date without her realizing it's a sports bar." Warren 77 offers nine beers on tap and a great food menu with everything from traditional bar food to fine dining options.
