


CITY MAP OF DETROIT

Currently on exhibition is Joshua White an Gary Panter's Light Show, an exhibition that fills the Museum's 22,000 square foot space. The Friday night social will take place at MOCAD.

He is currently serving as 2012 First Vice President and will be the 2013 President of the AIA. Jacob graduated from the University of Detroit in 1981 and was a cofounder of Urban Studio Arc tects (Tampa) in 1989. He has serve as the President of his local and state AIA chapters, as well as the AIA Florida Caribb/ean Regional Director.

Is the collaboration of local students, professionals, alumni, and faculty Art Deco is the theme for the evening. In the 19th century the architects in attendance would dress as the structures they had designed. The famous Fox Theatre, location of the Beaux Arts Ball, was opened in 1928. It was the first theatre to include a speaker system for films with sound and is the largest theatre to survive from the 1920s. The building blends together Chinese, Burmese, Indian, and Persian themes. The interior includes marble flooring, brass inlays, and Corinthian columns.

Lafayette Coney Island; 118 W. Lafayette, Detroit, MI

The premier coney island of the Detroit area.

Andrew's on the Corner; 201 Joeseph Compau, Detroit, MI

Located in the warehouse district of downtown Detroit, a grill in an industrial setting.

Campus Martius Park; 800 Woodward Avenue, Detroit, Michigan

Considered the focal point of Detroit, with close proximity of entertainment, food, and culture.

Ford Field; 2000 Brush St, Detroit, Michigan

Right Across from Comerica Park, Modern design incorporated into classic Hudson's Warehouse, Home of Detroit Lions

Detroit Institute of Arts; 5200 Woodward Avenue, Detroit, MI

One of the largest collections of art in the United States from Diego Rivera to Van Gogh.

Detroit Riverwalk; along the Detroit river

Three miles of accessible riverfront that includes pavillions, plazas, parks, and green spaces.

MGM Grand Detroit 1777 Third, Detroit, MI

The first luxury casino resort out of a metropolitian area of a city other than Las Vegas.
