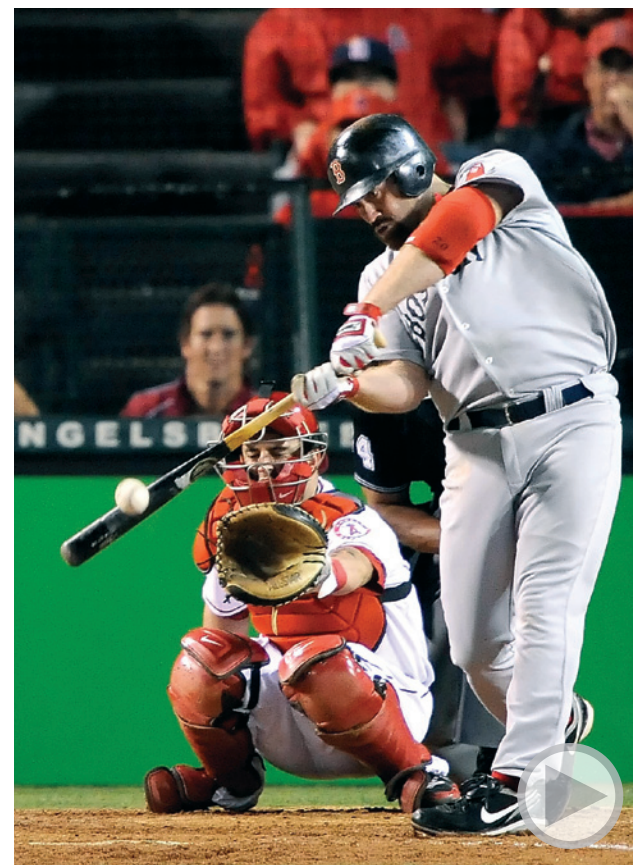

Forget that old Moneyball nickname... Youk is the Greek God of Line Drives nowadays... Was once again among the elite offensive performers in the American League last season... Batted .307 with a .965 OPS, 157 OPS+, and 19 homers... OPS would have been good for fifth in AL if he'd had enough plate appearances to qualify... Pounded fastballs to the tune of a .339 AVG and .617 SLG and only swung and missed on 3% of the heaters he saw... He played just 102 games, joining the lengthy list of walking wounded when he suffered a season-ending ruptured adductor muscle in his right thumb while swinging the bat against the Indians Aug. 3... OPS has risen in each successive season of his seven-year career... Mauled left-handed pitching last season, with a 1.311 OPS and eight homers in 89 at bats... Career .389 on-base percentage is 11th among active players... Clubbed 100th homer of his career on May 18 against Yankees ace CC Sabathia... With the arrival of Adrian Gonzalez and the departure of Adrian Beltre, moves from first base, where he won a Gold Glove in 2007, back to his natural position of third base... Played just two games at the hot corner last year, but 63 in '09... Finished third in AL Most Valuable Player voting in 2008 and sixth in '09.
