Rivers we fish:

BIG HOLE RIVER:

The Big Hole is known as one of the best freestone rivers in Montana, as it runs for 160 miles through canyons, braided channels, slicks and pocket water with an average of 3,000 fish per mile. Whether you are fishing the Salmonfly hatch in June or hoppers in August, this river is a dry fly fisherman's paradise.

BEAVERHEAD RIVER:

The Beaverhead River is a tail-water fishery that produces huge trout and prolific mayfly hatches. The steady water temperature and consistent flows make this tail-water a big fish factory. The Beaverhead River is home to Rainbows and Browns averaging 18-20 inches and 3-4lbs which make this blue-ribbon fishery legendary.

MADISON RIVER:

The Madison is known as the 50-mile riffle and one of the most famous rivers in the world. This is a bolder strewn pocket water fishery with deep channels and buckets. A trophy brown or rainbow can be hooked behind any bolder on this majestic river.

JEFFERSON RIVER:

The Big Hole and Beaverhead confluence make up the beginning of the Jefferson River. This river runs for 77-miles of unspoiled trout fishing. This is an uncrowned river that produces trout exceeding 5lbs.
