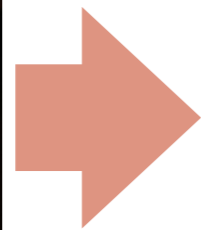


# Re-Design - Device

## Display and Information Issues 2,4,5,6,7



The device is shown left. Through the redesign process the product has become the device on the right.

The screen size was increased to A5 size in order to offer a more versatile and clear display.

The revised design has a larger screen, simple, effective graphical display and less options but more useful information.

It was comfortable to look at and offered room for information



Initially the device was a portable lie down screen. However it could not compete with other screens, making it forgettable. By **incorporating the stand**, the product instantly become more noticeable. The Display on the original was OK, but by **increasing the size** it becomes **clearer** and has room for a **graphical display**, as desired by the users answers to the questionnaire. [Appendix B]. **Buttons** were incorporated down the sides to help the user **navigate through** the screens and options, although these are **reduced in comparison** to the original device.

The initial feedback was excellent. Very warm response to the screen size and graphical display. However some users felt the **graph** was slightly **clinical** with connotations of hospital monitors. They also mentioned the buttons could be reduced in size and spaced out further. Therefore by putting in a **bar graph** the screen becomes **instantly clearer**, giving **instantaneous feedback** on whether usage is high or low.
