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**Education Leading to Employment and Career Training (ELECT) Student Works**

Since 2001, the School District of Philadelphia and Communities in Schools of Philadelphia, Inc. (CISP) have managed the After School Enrichment Academy Program (ASEA) in partnership. The program provides out of school time services to include after school and summer enrichment camp programming to under served inner city elementary and middle school aged children and youth. The program targets at risk youth with services and community resources to increase the safety of program participants and prevent their involvement with harmful behaviors that might jeopardize their futures. The goal of the program is to offer engaging activities during the hours when students are often unsupervised.

**Statistics**

- Average daily program attendance is over 85%
- In 2007-2008 60.6% of the students enrolled for 6 or more months improved their school attendance.
- In 2007-2008 61% of the students enrolled for 6 or more months improved their grade point average over the previous year's baseline.
- The 2006 Governor's Summit on Extra Learning Opportunities recognized the program as a best practice for out of school time experiences.
- The after school component annually serves over 1,100 students from October through May. The six-week summer enrichment experience serves 375 students.

**Allocations/Allotment**

Each location is budgeted \$187,500.00 to cover direct service staff (coordinator, teachers, assistants, interventionists, and security personnel); contracted services (enrichment consultants and evaluation); curriculum, instructional supplies and materials; and student services (cultural exposures, travel, and incentives).
