

The Morrow Flag:

For the flag I chose to go with a standard rectangular flag design. The flag is very simple to coincide with the simple laid back atmosphere of the village. In the middle of the flag is a three color representation of The Great Seal.

Surrounding the seal are stars depicting the different districts of Morrow that come together to make a whole. I will note that in my research I was not able to find a count of the districts in Morrow, so the amount of stars may need to be changed. Cradling the underside of the seal is a laurel wreath. Laurel wreaths are an age long symbol for victory. They are used in this design as a victorious symbol for Morrow's past, present, and future, as well as the victory of the residents in joining to create a great prosperous village.

The background color of blue for the flag is to symbolize the blue collar background of the town as well as to honor those who worked hard to build the town into what it is today.



The Great Seal of Morrow:

For the Village Seal I researched events that had a major influence on Morrow, things that changed how the residents lived and how Morrow would grow. The answer I came up with was the train coming through, which had a major hand in influencing the future of the village. It is also a great symbol of how Morrow is always moving forward.

I chose the old trestle bridge as my visual for the railroad and the village. It is a perfect fit because it's an iconic image for the village. It has affected all the village residents from the older residents remembering growing up and watching the train glide down it's rails to the younger generations still walking or running under it's old iron beams.

Underneath of the trestle flows the Little Miami River. I depicted a glimpse of this local landmark that lends it's name to the local school district.
