

New Dodge Viper debuts this week

The all-new 2008 Dodge Viper SRT10® ACR-short for American Club Race -with its "fanged" front splitter, adjustable rear wing and optimized front dive planes, will slither onto the Dodge display at this week's Los Angeles Auto Show. The latest addition to the Street and Racing Technology (SRT) family of performance vehicles, the 600 horsepower Dodge Viper SRT10 ACR is a street-legal Viper engineered to dominate on the race track. Because it is street legal, die-hard Viper and track enthusiasts can drive their car to the race track, run it at top speed on the track and then drive it home—obeying the speed limit, of course. "With the all-new 2008 Dodge Viper SRT10 ACR, SRT has taken the ultimate American sports car and injected it with an extra dose of racing DNA," Mike Accavitti, Director-Dodge Brand and SRT Global Marketing and Communications said. "With the Viper SRT10 as the starting point, SRT engineered a combination of reduced weight, race-tuned suspension and aerodynamic improvements to create the ultimate Viper for the street and track."

Grand Cherokee Laredo to feature diesel engine



In addition, pricing for diesel-equipped Grand Cherokee Limited and Overland models has been reduced by \$1,000æ By expanding engine availability and reducing existing prices, we hope that more consumers will be encouraged to take advantage of this clean, renewable fuel," John Plecha, Director—Jeep Brand Marketing and Global Communications, said. 

Dodge Dakota is 'America's best small pickup'

The 2008 Dodge Dakota pickup "offers features and capabilities that rivals can't match." This is just one of the complimentary observations that Thane Peterson made in his review of the Dakota in BusinessWeek magazine. Peterson wrote, "For buyers who want maneuverability of a small pickup combined with big-truck towing capacity, seating for up to six people and a powerful V-8 engine, the new Dakota may be the best small pickup on the market." While he called the styling of segment competitor, the Toyota Tacoma, "bland," Peterson praised the Dakota for its "highly distinctive front end, with an in-your-face grille." He noted that the Dakota drives "like a car," adding that "boy the ride is smooth, both on the highway and in town." Peterson concluded that the 2008 Dodge Dakota is "for buyers who want a little more size, power and roominess."

NHTSA closes investigation of Neon

The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) has closed its 15-month-old investigation of alleged loss of headlamp illumination in 2002-2003 Dodge Neon cars. The agency said its analysis of consumer complaints and Chrysler warranty data showed a low rate and declining trend in the Neon. The investigation affected nearly 250,000 vehicles. "Although the agency is very concerned whenever failures occur in an item of safety equipment such as headlights, a safety-related defect trend has not been identified at this time," NHTSA said.

California files emissions lawsuit

The State of California is suing the Bush administration for failing to act on the state's request for approval to enforce greenhouse gas emissions limits on vehicles, *Automotive News* reported. The EPA has promised to answer the request, also called a waiver, before the end of the year. Dave McCurdy, president of the Alliance of Automobile Manufacturers, described the lawsuit as "not helpful to the waiver process." The Alliance is currently undecided as to whether it will intervene in the lawsuit.

Chevy may get small seven-seat minivan

General Motors Corp. will build a compact minivan for Chevrolet in 2009, according to a report in *Automotive News*. Code-named the MPV-7, the vehicle will provide seating for seven passengers and will be styled after the next generation of GM's Opel Zafira. The minivan, which will be built at GM's assembly plant in Hamtramck, Mich., will be sold in the United States, as well as exported to other markets. The vehicle will fill a gap in Chevy's lineup that was created by the discontinuation of the slow-selling Venture minivan.
