The Landing
375 Water St.

Built in 1905 and designed by architect W.T. Whiteway, this building was originally known as the Kelly Douglas Building. It characterizes the general history of wholesaling in Gastown.

Edward Hotel
302 Water St.

Built from 1910-1912 in the Edwardian style and designed by the Swift Canadian Company Construction Department on the site of Gastown's original butcher shop.

Malkin First Warehouse
137 Water St.

Built in 1898, this building is an example of the influence of the Chicago School of Architecture. In 1996, it was converted to lofts and residences.

Hudson House
321 Water St.

Built in 1894 and also known as Hudson's Bay Company Warehouse, Hudson House, or Mussenden Building. The original part of this building was designed by C.O. Wickenden.

Leckie Building
220 Cambie St.

Built in 1908 and also known as the J. Leckie and Co. Factory and warehouse, this building was designed by local architects Dalton and Eveleigh.

Winters Hotel
102 Water St.

Built in 1907 and designed by William Tuff Whiteway for Mrs. A.M. Winters.

Hotel Dominion
92 Water St.

Built in 1900-1901 and designed by Emil Guenther Architectural. This building is in the Victorian Italianate style and originally as Sherdahl block.

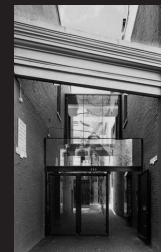

1 Water St.

Built from 1910-1912 in the Edwardian style and designed by the Swift Canadian Company Construction Department on the site of Gastown's original butcher shop.

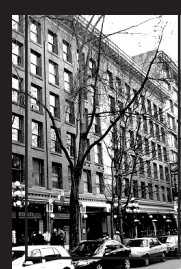

Gaoler's Mews
12 Water St.

Built Mid-1800's, as Vancouver's first jail. It was burned down in the Great Vancouver fire of 1886 and replaced by a brick fire hall. Currently the Irish Heather Pub is in place of the jail.

Malkin Building
55 Water St.

Built in 1907 and also known as Malkin's Warehouse or 3rd Malkin Warehouse by architects John Parr and Thomas Fee. It shows strong influences of the Chicago School of Architecture.

Byrnes Block
8 Water St.

Built from 1886-1887, this building is also been known as the Alhambra Hotel and Herman Block. It was built by Victoria based auctioneer George Byrnes.

Hotel Europe
43 Powell St.

Built from 1908-1909 and commissioned by Angelo Calori in the flatiron style. It was the first reinforced concrete structure built in Canada.

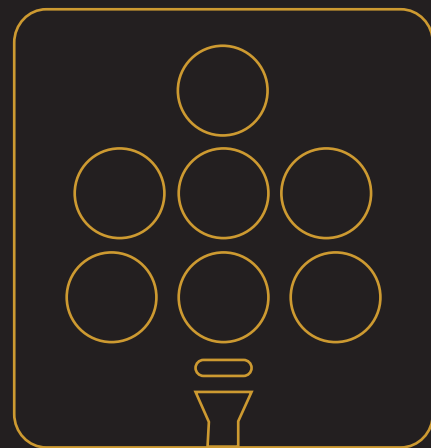

The first downtown in Vancouver, this area was established the same year that Canada became a nation. Gastown became the third largest city in Canada. Today Gastown retains much of its historic charm. In 1886, on June 13th, a brush-clearing fire became uncontrollable burning down all but two of Vancouver's four hundred buildings. During the Depression, Gastown deteriorated turning into a skid road area until the 1960's when preventing demolition of the area became the purpose of a group of dedicated citizens. By 1971, the provincial government declared Gastown a historical area protecting it's heritage buildings.
