Immerse yourself in Lisbon's culture

Local Lisboetas join tourists on the colorful trams and elevadores (elevators) that transport people up, down and around this hilly city by the sea. The elevadores whisk tourists from one level of the central city to the next, while antique trams zip along five crisscrossing routes. Route No. 28 stops along Baixa, the Sé Cathedral and Castelo de São Jorge, near the Four Seasons Hotel Ritz Lisbon, which Charman's Trip guests will call home.

The slopes of Lisbon offer views from nearly every corner. The Alfama, the oldest district of Lisbon, is the site of St. George's Castle, which offers panoramic views of the city, the Tagus River and the Atlantic Ocean. The beach towns of Estoril and Cascais are just a 30-minute train ride away. Roman ruins, Romantic-period treasures and lively cafes await. Like the city's famous azulejos, which abound in the Alfama, Lisbon presents a vibrant mosaic of experiences.

Savor the delicacies of the city

Lisbon is known for slow meals full of flavor and conversation. Restaurants and cafes offer traditional Portuguese cuisine as well as innovative takes on the region's plentiful fish and shellfish. The famous cafe Antiga Confeitaria de Belém is known for its famous custard tarts, a local specialty on the menu since 1841. In friendly taverns and sophisticated bistros, you'll find Mediterranean cuisine at its best — fresh bread, olive oil, cheese, sausages and fine Portuguese wine.
