Contest Guidelines

Entry Submission: September 1-30, 2014

Guidelines for participation in the Arapahoe Library District Latino Art Contest for Teens are as follows:

The competition is open to all Colorado residents, ages 11-18.

The Latino Art Contest for Teens entry form must be fully completed, securely attached to each piece of artwork and submitted in person to any Arapahoe Library District branch or bookmobile stop.

Artwork must be ready for display, matted and reinforced on the back with cardboard or mounted on either black or white board and be no larger than 30" x 36".

Winners will be notified within two weeks of the contest end. Make sure you bring some form of identification to verify your age to your nearest Arapahoe Library District branch or bookmobile stop if you are selected as a winner.

Theme: "*What Hispanic Heritage and Culture Means to Me!*"

Categories:

Drawing, Painting, and Crafts

This category includes: oil, acrylic, watercolors, pencil drawing, ink drawing (black and white scratchboard included), pastel, crayon, charcoal, fabric textile (yarn or threads included), mixed media, any paper, ceramic, sculpture, or wood crafts. *NOTE: A box or container to move the 3-D artwork must accompany all such entries.*

Photography, Poetry, Film, and Computer Generated Art

This category includes: 3-D, black & white, color, and digital photography, documentaries, video animation, combination of video and animation or flip books, minimum 20 pages (flip books not provided). Film or video entries must be submitted on DVD format only and be no longer than 5 minutes *including titles and credits*. Oral poetry must be submitted on DVD or CD format only and be no longer than 5 minutes *including name and title*.

Participating in this contest constitutes your express acceptance of the following conditions:

1. No prizes, awards or any other type of recognition will be given to any entry submitted by Arapahoe Library District employees or their family members.
2. Multiple entries are permitted, but an entrant may win only once. Group entries are welcome but are eligible only for gift card prizes.
3. The contest is open to Colorado residents, ages 11-18.
4. An entry form must be fully completed, securely attached to each piece of artwork and submitted in person to any Arapahoe Library District branch or bookmobile stop. Entries may be submitted Monday, September 1, 2014 through Tuesday, September 30, 2014.

5. By entering the contest, entrants grant the Arapahoe Library District a royalty-free, worldwide, perpetual, non-exclusive license to reproduce, display, distribute, and create derivative works of the entries, in whole or in part, in any media now existing or subsequently developed, for any educational, promotional, publicity, exhibition, archival, scholarly and all other library purposes. Any entry reproduced will include a credit as feasible. The Arapahoe Library District will not be required to seek any additional approval in connection to such uses.
6. You further grant the Arapahoe Library District the right to use information that you provide as part of your submission, including your name, city, age, and contact information for the following purposes: 1) Contact information will only be used to notify you in the event you are selected as a winner of the prize; and 2) First name, city and age may be announced to the public in connection with winning and/or finalist entries.

Arapahoe Library District reserves the right to modify these Contest Rules at any time.

Prizes:

1. All winners are required to verify identity with proper identification. Winners may forfeit any and all winnings if verification cannot or has not been made within one week of notification.
2. Odds of winning a prize depend on the number and quality of eligible entries received.
