ANTHONY OWENS

Head Coach, 2nd Season

Anthony Owens, 33, is in his second year as the head coach after joining the University of Great Falls coaching staff in 2014 following a five-year stint as an assistant at Portland State.

Owens led the Argos to a 17-12 overall mark and the first round of the Frontier Conference playoffs in his first season. The Argos were ranked as high as No. 12 in the NAIA Coaches' Poll during Owens' initial season and beat three ranked teams. The Argos upset then-No. 1 Cal State San Marcos 74-71 at the Chandler-Gilbert (Ariz.) Classic in December, and knocked off then-No. 9 Montana Western 89-84 in January. UGF also beat then-No. 23 Lewis-Clark State 79-73 in January.

Owens also coached All-Frontier Conference first team performer TJ Harris in Harris' final season.

The former UGF star came to UGF from PSU of the Division I Big Sky Conference, where he served as an assistant coach under Vikings head coach Tyler Geving. The program had a 69-84 record during Owens' time on Geving's staff, including a trip to the Collegeinsider.com Tournament in 2014 – the first postseason appearance for the program since the 2009 NCAA Tournament.

Owens led the Frontier Conference in rebounding and was an All-Conference selection for the Argonauts in 2003. He was also a two-time team MVP.

Owens is renowned for his recruiting ties and his ability to sign quality student-athletes. He was instrumental in Portland State's transition off probation and back into Academic Progress Rate compliance.

Prior to joining Portland State Owens was an assistant coach at the College of Eastern Utah. The Eagles went 25-7 during his year there (2008-09). Before coaching at CEU, he was an assistant coach for two years at Eastern Arizona College. EAC went 53-13 over those two years, reaching the Region 1 Tournament finals two years in a row, and advancing to the national tournament in 2007-08.

Before coming to UGF Owens played at Arkansas-Fort Smith Junior College, and was part of a team that compiled a 55-11 record over two seasons.

Owens earned a B.A. psychology in 2006 from UGF. He is a native of Searcy, Ark.



KEVIN SMITH

Assistant Coach, 1st Season

Kevin Smith, 34, is in his first year as an assistant coach for the University of Great Falls men's basketball program.

Smith comes to UGF from the University of Montevallo in Alabama. While at UM, Smith coached Peach Belt Conference Player of the Year, All-Region and Division II All-American Troran Brown. The Falcons won the Peach Belt West Division championship and reached the NCAA Division II Sweet 16.

Prior to his stint at UM, he was an assistant coach at Wallace State Community College in Alabama. Smith was the lead recruiter for the states of Georgia, Virginia and Tennessee.

Smith returned to the United States following a lengthy playing and coaching career overseas. From 2009-2011 he held various coaching roles in New Zealand and Australia, including a stint as player/head coach of West Auckland CBL team that reached the national playoffs for the first time.

Smith had stints playing professionally in Luxembourg, Iceland and Finland, as well as six seasons at several levels in New Zealand and Australia. He retains citizenship in New Zealand.

Smith played one season for legendary coach Don Haskins at the University of Texas-El Paso before attending Coastal Georgia Community College, where he was an NJCAA First Team All-American. He became an NAIA All-American at Lee (Tennessee) University, where he was also the conference player of the year.

Coach Smith is responsible for recruiting at UGF, including international recruiting, and assisting Coach Owens in day-to-day operations of the program.

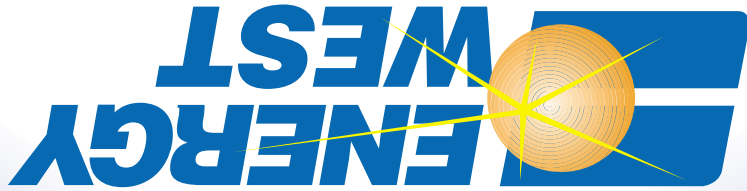

Public Awareness

Damage Prevention

Homeowners protect yourself from injury. Before planting trees, shrubs, installing fences, mail boxes or whatever excavating activities you are doing, make a call to your one call center. In Montana, call ULC (Utilities Underground Location Center) at 811 at least two business days before you dig, auger, or move dirt in any way. Year to date, homeowners have damaged numerous gas facilities. Remember for your safety and to minimize expensive repair bills, call 811 to have your gas facilities located prior to any digging.

Awareness of Hazards and Prevention Measures

If you come in contact with a natural gas pipeline leak take the following steps:

- Leave the area immediately
- Move to a safe location and then call Energy West 406-791-7500
- Abandon any equipment being used in or near the suspected leak
- Warn others to stay away when possible

Leak Recognition

Learn the warning signs of natural gas pipeline leaks

- A rotten egg smell
- Dirt spraying in the air
- A hissing sound
- Bubbling in a pond, creek or river
- Dead or dying vegetation

Leak Response

What to do when a leak occurs

- **DO NOT** light a match, start an engine, use a telephone or cell phone, turn on or off light switches, or do anything that may cause a spark
- **DO NOT** attempt to extinguish a natural gas fire
- **Call 911**
- **DO NOT** attempt to operate pipeline equipment

Carbon monoxide

Carbon monoxide is a silent killer. Assure that fuel-burning appliances are installed,

maintained, and used properly and safely. That includes having an annual inspection of heating and venting equipment by a "qualified heating and plumbing shop" prior to the heating season, and the use of a carbon monoxide alarm that meets current standards.

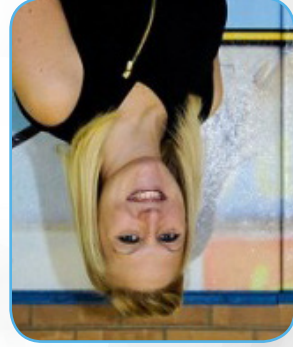

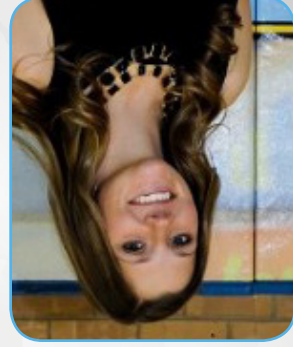
Prior to LBC, Steinbarger was an assistant coach at Franklin (Ind.) College, where the team finished with a two-year record of 35-18 to place second both years.
