Personal Narrative

I'm a hematologist with a clinical specialization in sarcoma and melanoma, and my research focus is in cancer bioinformatics. At The Ohio State University, I serve as an Assistant Professor in Medical Oncology and in Biomedical Informatics.

My current work focuses on developing computational tools to improve prognostic and predictive models in sarcoma and or melanoma. In particular, I am interested in integrating data from RNA expression, next-generation sequencing, and public cancer databases in order to help guide treatment decisions.

I'm inspired by the mission of the OSUCCC – James to someday achieve a cancer-free world, and feel honored to be a part of that vision. Since each patient is unique, the medical and therapeutic regimens we provide should mirror that, and I believe the better our ability to accurately predict responses and customize treatments, the more positive outcomes we will see.

I've participated in five clinical trials, two of which are ongoing: one around a new medical treatment for metastatic soft tissue sarcoma, the other on comparative post-surgical treatment plans for patients after resection of a high-risk melanoma. I've authored or co-authored 13 medical manuscripts, delivered five presentations, and presented a lecture on Understanding Medical Treatment for Melanoma at the

Melanoma Research Symposium in 2013. I'm excited about the work we're doing at the OSUCCC – James, and all the potential medical breakthroughs to come.
