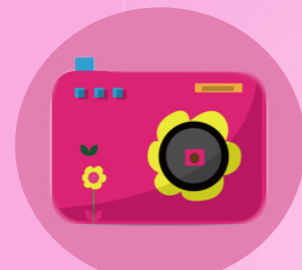

Children can actively type their names into the box.

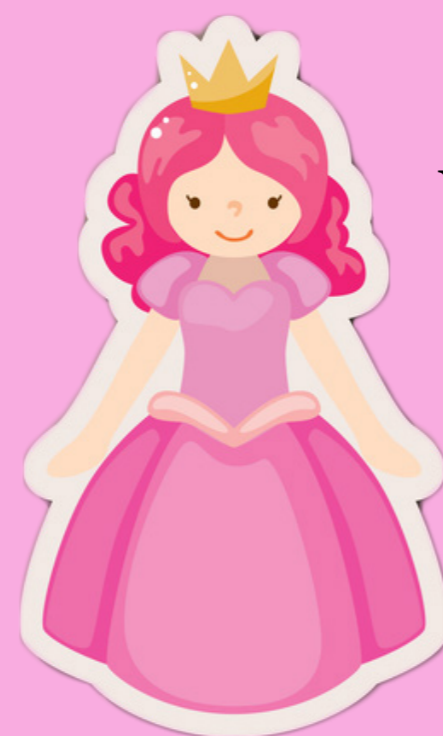
Pressing the tick will confirm while pressing the cross will return the typing box to it's original form.

A greater amount of dresses will be unlocked after points are gained. At this point an arrow will be present to move to the next screen of princess choices.



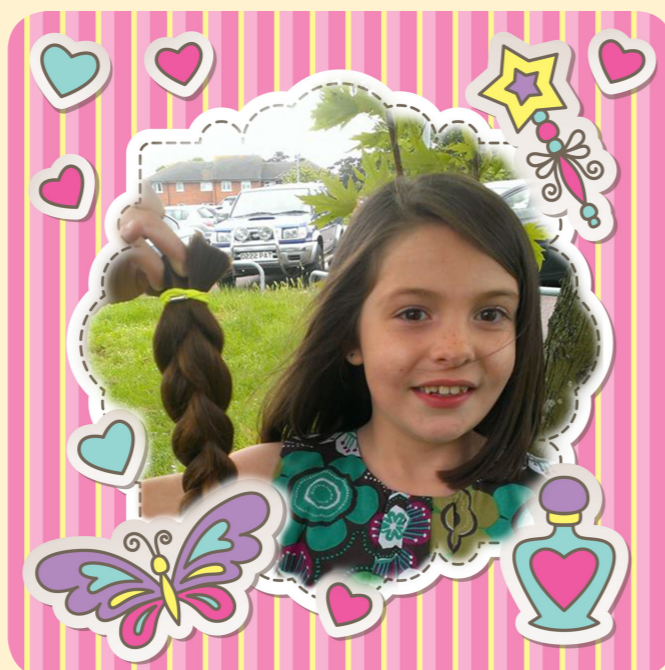

Ruby was very brave and her mummy was proud. Ruby had her hair cut at school and was thrilled afterwards.

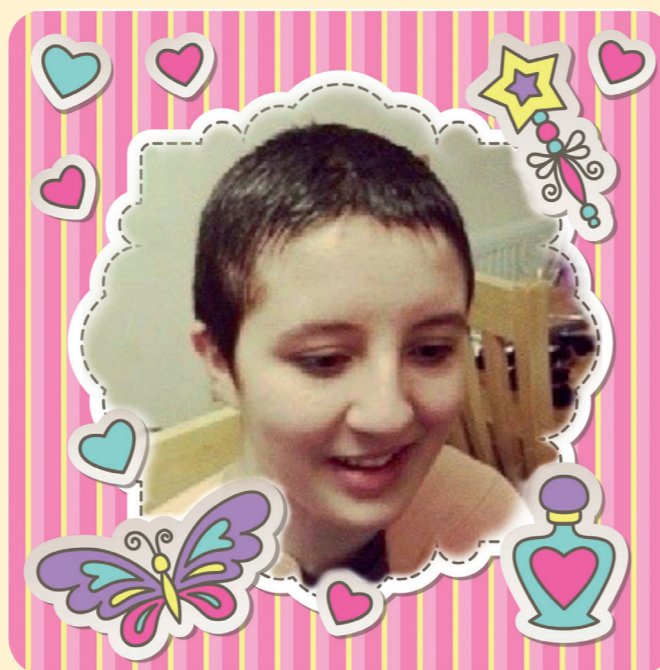

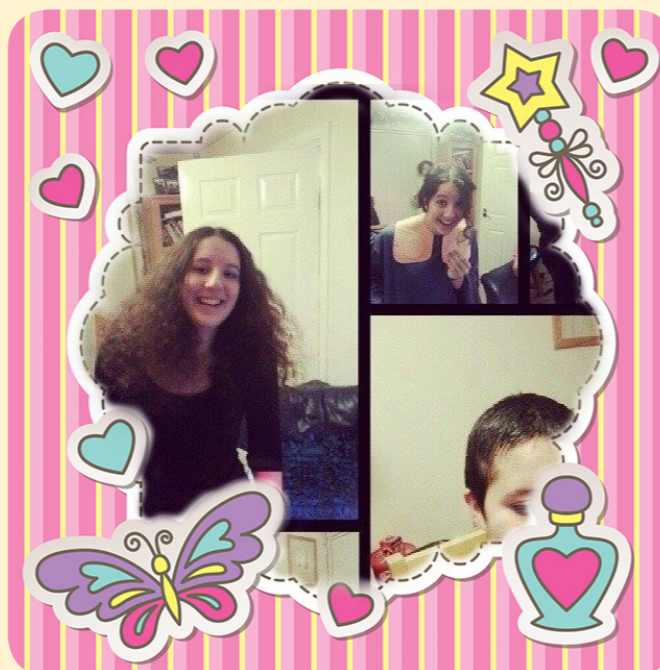

Miah was 7 when she donated her hair for the first time. She thought it was a very good idea to give it to someone who needed it more than she did.



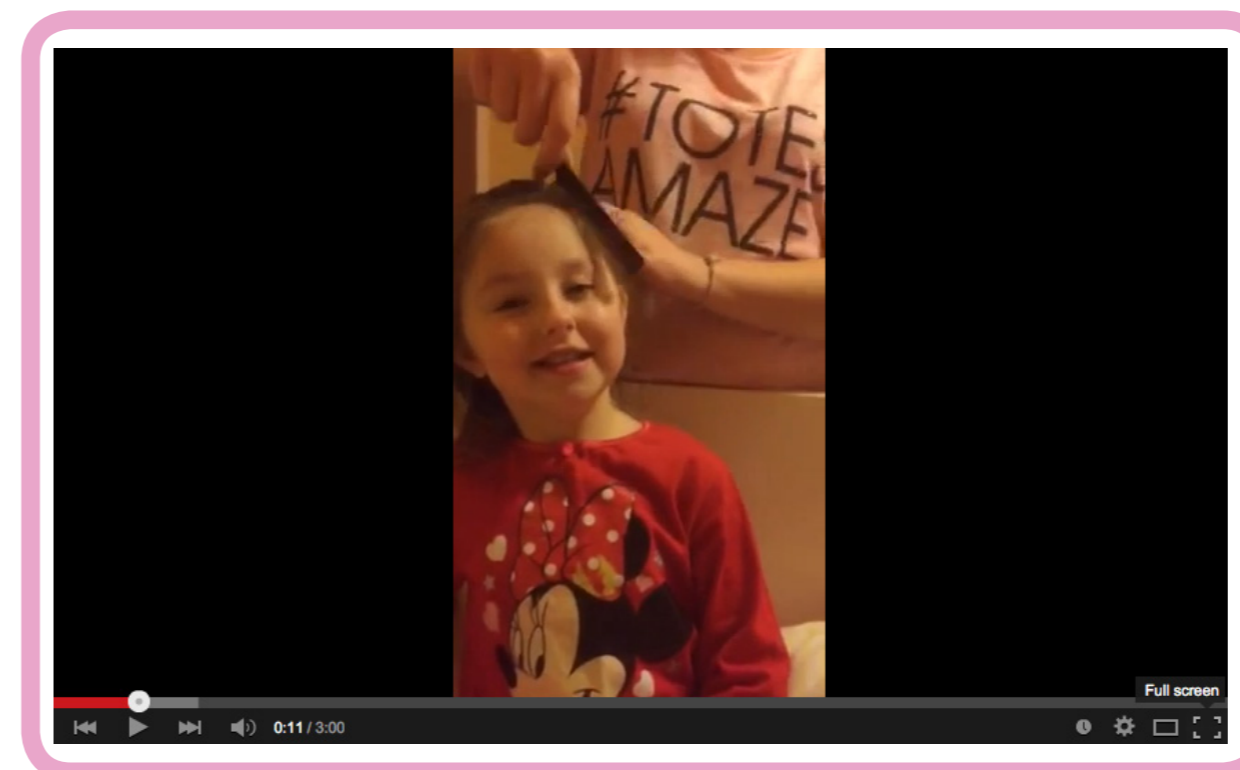
At first she felt nervous about getting her hair cut but afterwards she felt great! After all, Miah thinks the job that The Little Princess Trust do is very special.

On average each wig costs £350, meaning any donation will help to provide for children who have lost their hair through cancer treatment and rare conditions. At The Little Princess Trust we try our hardest to cater to everyone's interests when organising fundraising charity events. We include a variety of activities to engage as many people as possible. In the past we have held events such as:
Pink Car Rally, Run For Little Princess Trust and Across The Divide walk event.

About us

At The little Princess Trust we supply wigs to young boys and girls who suffer [hair loss from cancer](#). Some may not require this, but for others it can be a difficult daunting time within the treatment process.

The charity was formerly set up in remembrance of Hannah Tarplee who died from cancer in 2005. Her parents created the Little Princess Trust and astonishingly, within the first year, helped over 1000 children.

The Little Princess Trust were thrilled to have partnered up with one of the worlds greatest cancer support charities, Macmillan. The partnership began during Macmillan's [shave or style campaign](#) in July 2014.

We have given away 2000 free wigs; many supporters participated by donating their locks to the charity. Jessie J and ITV's Mr Selfridge actress, Sai Bennett support The Little Princess Trust by donating her hair.

One of the most common and noticeable side effects of cancer treatment is hair loss. Many people who suffer from this side effect are surprised at the emotional impact it can have on you through your treatment. And our job at The Little Princess Trust is to make this battle easier for you.

Our services

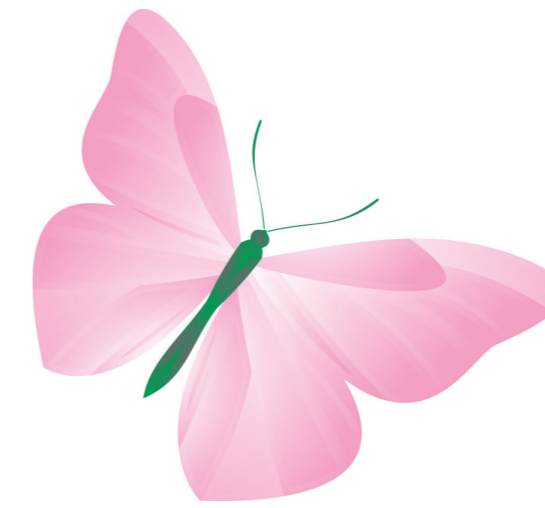
As a charity we work with specialists to ensure we provide the best services possible. Operating with professional hairdressers and hair suppliers we present real life tailored wigs catered specifically for the child's request. From blonde locks to a short dark bob, we aim to continue with their original look or anything else of their option choice.

In addition to this we as a charity also supply support to children who are also suffering with other conditions that relate to weight loss, the most common being alopecia and thyroid problems.

By supplying this kind of support to ill children we aim to put some dignity back into the lives of those who are suffering. To ensure that parents/guardians are fully aware of [the process](#) and FAQs we try to put them into contact with suppliers as local to them as possible.

We are unable to allocate more than one wig to each child, strictly because of supplier regulations. Despite this we hope that the wig we do supply to each child will help him/her as well as their family whilst dealing with such a traumatic condition. We as a charity cannot always guarantee that your wig will arrive before the hair loss begins, but can

Thinking about donating your hair?

The Rules.

- Hair that can be donated -
- over 17cm/7 inches in length
 - clean and dry
 - any colour
 - can be bleached
 - more than 10% grey in colour

- Hair that can't be accepted -
- afro hair
 - hair extensions
 - mostly grey hair
 - dreadlocks
 - wet or damp hair
 - hair that hasn't been cut recently

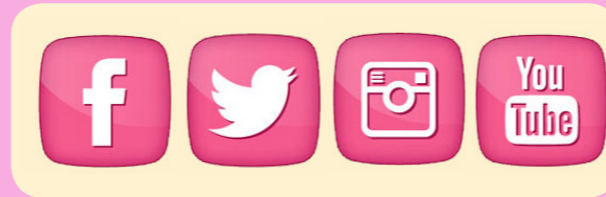

How long was Ruby's hair before she cut it?

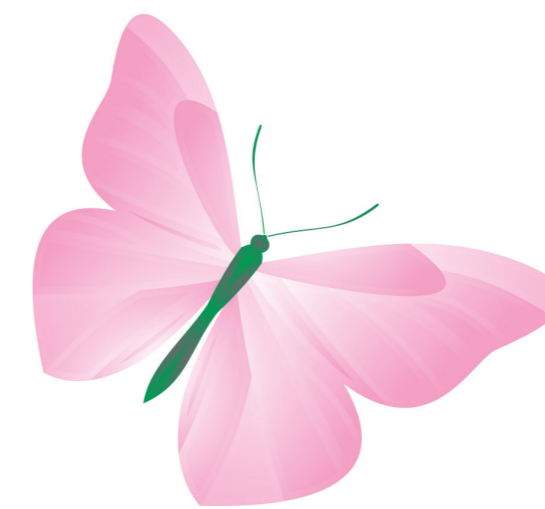
Ruby had hair below her bottom!

Annabelle's mum will walk onto the page. Animation works well with our target audience as children are being entertained whilst engaging with the words of the story.

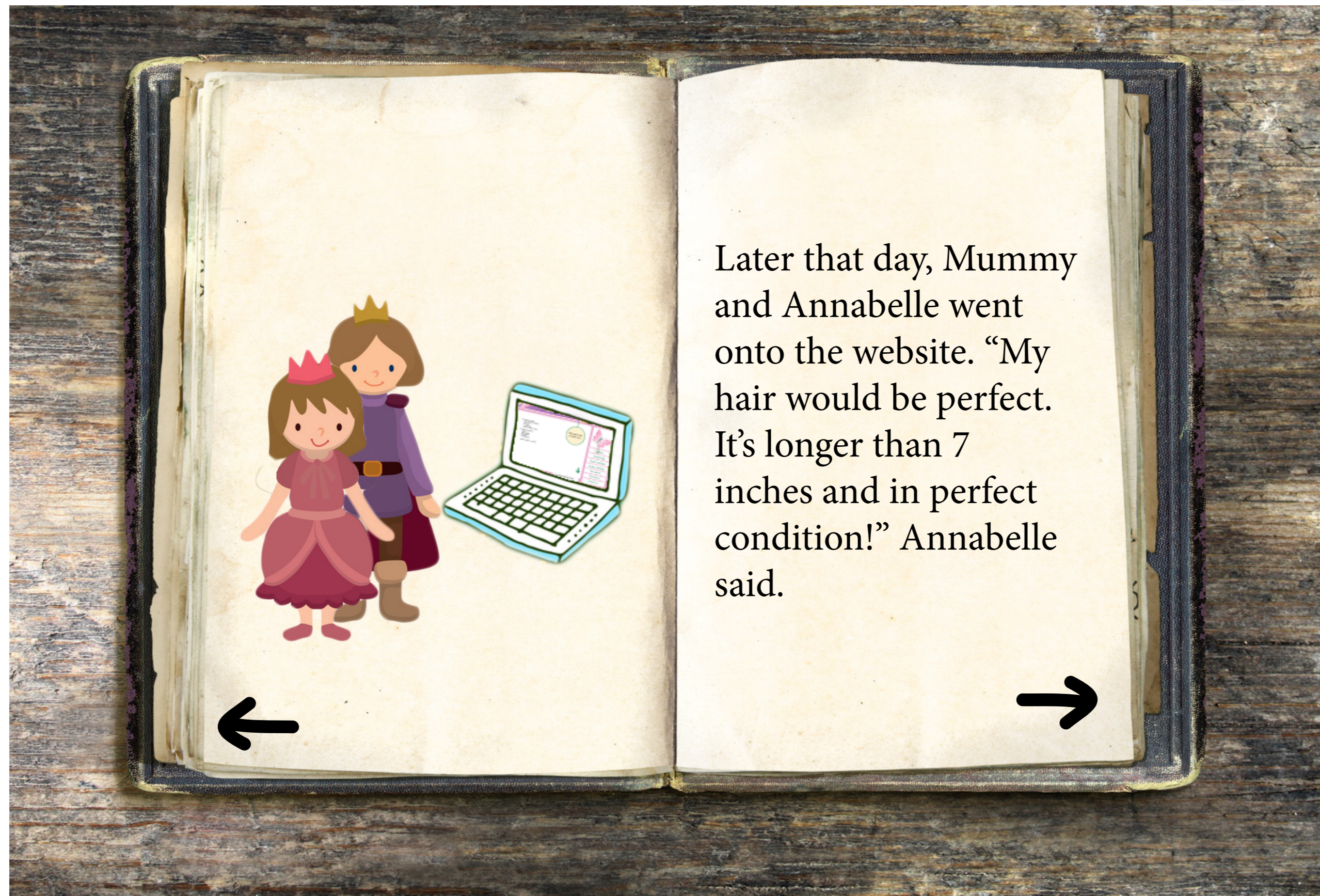


Mummy said that was a very brave thing to do. "We can go onto The Little Princess Trust website to find out more."

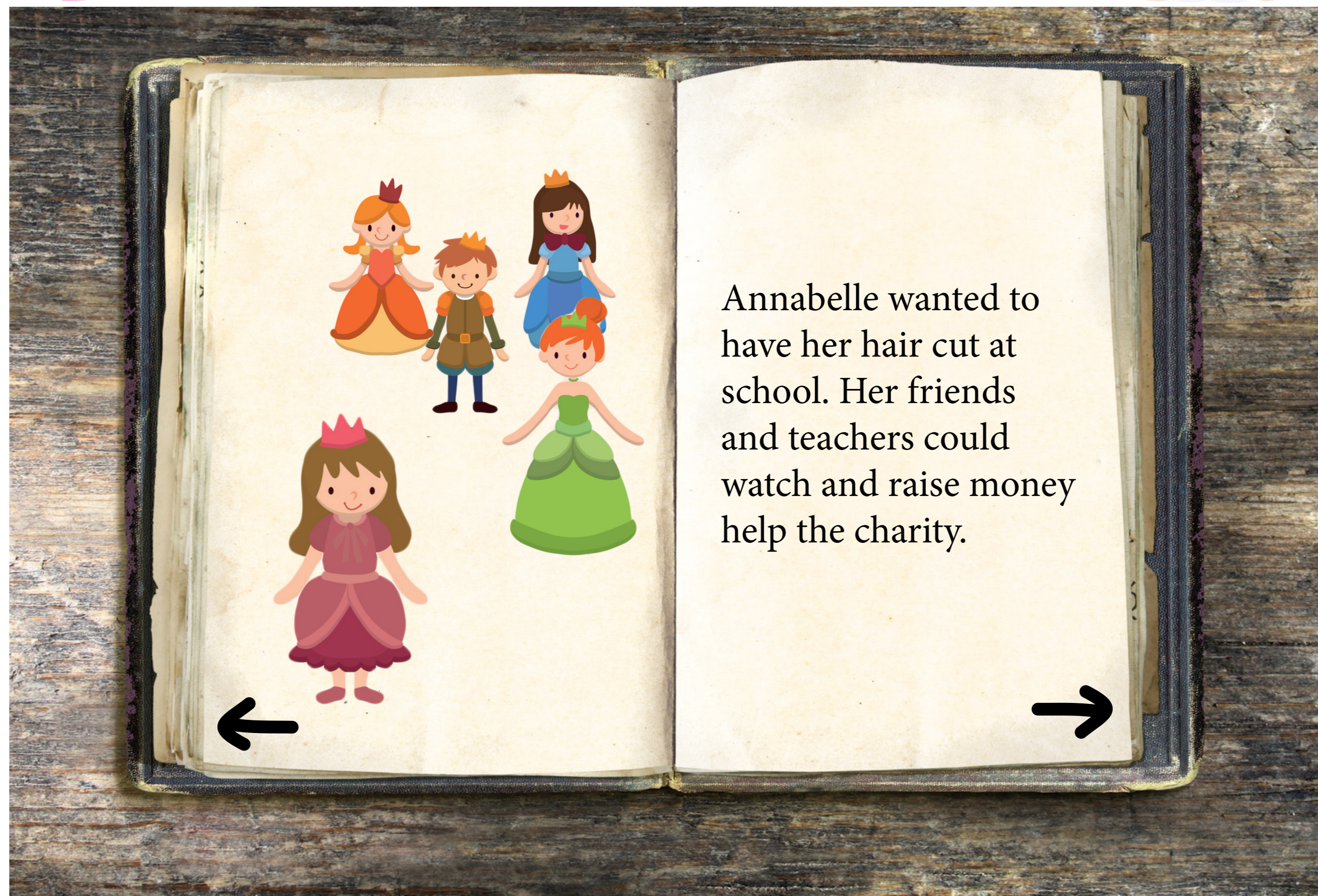
The thought bubble will progressively appear, one bubble at a time.

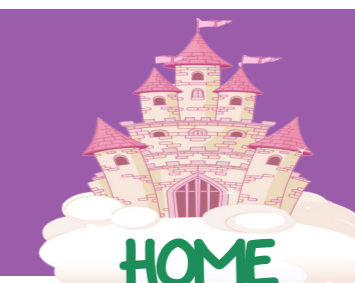
