





Merit scholarships If you have demonstrated exceptional academic achievement or talent in art, music, theatre, or debate, you may qualify for one of these awards:

- O Academic merit scholarships—\$6,000 to 18,000
 No separate application is required
- Theatre/music/art/debate scholarships—\$1,000 to 10,000
 Contact the appropriate department to apply
- National Merit Scholarships—\$2,000
 Awarded to National Merit Finalists
- Semmes Distinguished Scholars in Science awards—Full Tuition plus a \$5,000 research stipend Separate scholarship applications are required; candidates must submit an Early Action application for admission and this scholarship application by either November 1, Early Action I or January 1, Early Action II.

Need-based financial aid To help pay educational costs, many students qualify for need-based aid, which can include grants, low-interest loans, and campus employment.

Apply by submitting the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) between January 1 and February 15. The FAFSA can be found at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Trinity's school code is **003647**.

A few scholarships such as the science and technology FAST grant are awarded to students who demonstrate both financial need and academic achievement. Separate applications are required.

How to apply Trinity holistically evaluates each applicant by considering course rigor, grade point average, class rank (if reported), standardized test scores, application essay, recommendations, special talent, and co-curricular activities.
