


Content





Tell us a bit about your acting journey.

I hail from Jaipur and did school plays from as early as when I was three year old. It is from there the seeds of an actor were sown in me. My father was in the army and he never wanted me to be an actor, and that

elling to different cities and trying my luck at acting, I finally decided to take that leap of faith and move to Mumbai. It was a great learning experience for me, without money and family around, I was struggling to make ends meet. Ultimately, my persistence paid off and I bagged the role in Balaji productions' Kahin to Hoga. It has been 14 fulfilling years now and there has been no looking back from that day.



How easy was the transition from small to the big screen?

I have always believed in my acting abilities and thus the transition was favorable. I feel an actor has to keep on struggling to find the best out of himself. I was never involved in a theatre group or an acting school, whatever acting talent I have, comes from within. After doing two daily soaps for the small screen, I was craving diversity and 'Aamir' came my way. Initially, people had apprehensions about my acting skills, a lot of them even believed that I carried the hefty tag of a 'small screen' actor, but Raj Kumar Gupta, the director had immense faith in me and wanted me for the role. And so it happened. I always wanted to grow as an actor and that is something which drives me till today.

What keeps you motivated?

I feel there are a lot more talented actors in Bollywood as they have been at any point in the history of Indian cinema. For my role in Aamir, I was trained by Nawazuddin Siddiqui, as both Raj Kumar Gupta and AnuragKashyap had wanted me to observe his theatrics. I look upto Mr. Bachchan as someone who has an inspiring body of work spread across generations. Also, from the new breed, Ranbir Kapoor is a very promising actor as well. Talking about inspirations, my mother is my biggest source of motivation till today. Even after all these years, she is genuinely proud of my work and her support gives me immense strength to pursue my dreams.

What works more - Luck or Talent?




Tell us something about your upcoming movie 'Fever'.



You are an Artist, an Educator, a language and a cultural instructor. It's rare to see such a vast profile. What keeps you interested all day?

Positive vibes and constructive things that we tend to ignore, surround us. I feel inspired and influenced by dynamic people around me, which include my role models... mother, father, my sister who is an actress, and many personalities I met in France. But variety is something I need to stay alive and to entertain myself.

This is one of the reasons why I have rarely gone into a full time job, even in teaching. It's not my glass of wine!

You have been in the Art field for many years? How has been your journey? Has living in France affected your art?

My experiences in India are different from those in France, contrasts. What I am today as an artist, I owe it a lot to France. Artistically speaking, I found here all what I needed for my creative pursuits. Past 10 years have gone so quick. What's interesting about working in France is, art can be mixed with languages, so on and so forth. While instructing Hindi to foreigners, I discovered my love to educate others about Indian culture. It was an eye opening experience for me. And then there are so many cultural cafés and institutions where you can exhibit art work and teach too.

But I enjoy working in India too, teaching kids about art, taking them to Museums. They are like sponges at younger age, they'll absorb all that you make them experience. In India not many people know the real value of art, or who want to buy art. So I think the art education is important at a younger age, that's what 'Flow India' does, whom I work with. My art has also gone through many chapters and series and has evolved too!

What is your secret for continuous inspiration and determination for this field? How have you managed your daily life and your career?

Hah, haha. I was born to inspire? Or to be inspired... I don't believe in regrets about the past. Each event in our life teaches us something or other. I love teaching kids. Whenever I share knowledge and teach them, I just feel like a state like Nirvana!

My constant urge to explore and never to fail, keeps it going I think!! Any kind of change in life takes its own time to settle. So is my case, now I feel a kind of settled and trying to balance out personal and Professional life. Also when you know each day is going to be different, it is exciting. You want to make the best of it. It's tough too but you learn to become responsible.

The great indo-French painter... RAZA in Paris (A True Inspiration for ME)

I used to meet Raza ji in his Parisian studio (around 2006...) to know his reason d'être in France, for inspirations and his opinions on my work. He would love to talk about his journey... over n over again. His own works were highly based on Indian Tantra art and mine were becoming more and more western as I had started studying in Paris. For minutes before ringing on his doorbell Id hesitate, feel nervous, because strong and self-sufficient people could easily break you. But he never discouraged me or made me feel an oddman. Rather he would talk about his Indian roots, how important it is to feel connected with your values. He liked my new works and used to boost my spirit like a Guru or a preacher.... what I was missing in my Art College there. Art world and budding artists would miss him.

Despite the huge availability of talent in India, we are still not able to showcase the potential on global level, or even in the country level. What are your suggestions to bridge this gap?

Professionalism has to take front seats in all domains. Realising that a graduate has passed out genuinely by all his efforts, respecting each other and each other's job, we could improve the working scene in India. It's not because he is from a particular caste or region that we have to ignore or favour. Or say "contacts", KNOWING INFLUENCIAL people is as good as being rich in India. Chamcha-giri has to stop. Then the real talent will rise. Especially in art, a son of an artist will already have a space in art gallery, whether or not he deserves it!

There is no real Art critics. Criticism in general lacks in our society. If anybody or a group tries to criticise something about our society or culture, he is massacred and is condemned.

India should learn intellectual things from the west, not just short dresses and boozing in bars, especially the younger generation. In France, there are so many Radio channels where you have interviews of creative people, debates about issues related to daily lives, there is freedom to speech. Anyone and everyone has access to them, while driving. Definition of 'entertainment' is different here. We need to maintain our 'culture'. Sorry but that's the verity!



Do you think in India it is easy to pursue a full time career in this field without any other source of income?

In India? No, one cannot be just an artist, paint whole day and live his life like Van Gogh, Monet or those artist who make us dream. That's why many end up being art teachers in schools or graphic designers. I remember my College time in Delhi when we used to discuss about our futures. Not many were ready to face the reality that was awaiting us. At times it was a family constraint to look for job after College. Then me, to avoid the stereotype, I decided to escape, and went to France. And the Simran learnt to live her life by other means. Thanks to my parents for that!

India is a vast country, so many things going on. Life is fast too. Literally we have no time to breathe in Delhi, though not because of pollution. Opportunities should be created, we can't keep waiting whole life for something to happen. It's a very challenging field, but gratifying in the end. New art centres and museums are coming up, new spaces for new ideas. That's positive!



Any Career suggestion for newcomer? How has your work evolved since you began your own work?

If you have a little dream inside you, try finding ways on how could you realise them. Take help from seniors or experts. Actually things have changed! Today even 10 years is a big generation gap, I feel like I'm an old woman when talking to a 20 year old. But, when I taught in Pearl academy and LISAA School of design, I encountered the generation gap. We almost didn't live in the same worlds, so I had to do a lot of effort to come to their levels and get them to follow me and be interested in what I had to teach! Don't give up!

My art work is like a river stream, it keeps moving, flowing and changing the course. From oil paintings to gouache, videos to installation art, photography to mix-media. I don't like writing long texts on my work, not my job, may be of an art critic or curator. I got opportunities to show my work in big Museum to small regional art centre. I can't be happier!
