

Directions:

From Galway city centre you can take a **bus** or **taxi** to NUI Galway.There is a taxi rank at the top of Eyre Square. The number 4 Bus Eireann service from Eyre Square to Newcastle serves the University.Ask to be dropped off as near as possible to the Arts Millennium Building

By Car from Oranmore:

On approaching Galway follow signs for Galway / Clifden N59
Follow the dual carriageway to the Martin roundabout, and take

the 2nd exit (signposted Galway West)

 Proceed to the next roundabout (Lynch) and take the 2nd exit (signposted Galway / N6)

— At the next roundabout (Morris) take the 2nd exit (signposted Clifden)

— At the next roundabout (Font) take the 2nd exit (again signposted Clifden)

— Take the 2nd exit at the next roundabout (Kirwan)

- At the next roundabout (Bodkin) take the 4th exit (signposted Clifden / N59)

— At the next set of traffic lights turn left (signposted Lower Salthill)

— Continue to the next set of traffic lights (AIB Bank on the left), turn left onto Distillery Road. This is the entrance for all car parks for the University.

Parking Information

There is very limited paid parking facilities on Campus. We strongly recommend you avail of public transport. Pay and Display (P&D) spaces are located in three locations on campus. Please see the Map of Pay & Display Parking Locations. If you park in a P&D space, you must display a valid P&D ticket. Parking available from Distillery Road Entrance and St. Anthony's Entrance is close to Arts Millennium Building.

The annual VOLT conference gives Irish volunteer managers the opportunity to explore issues related to co-ordinating volunteer programmes. This conference looks at the issue of leadership in volunteer management. Throughout the day, we will explore the concept of leadership and what this means to those involved in managing volunteer programmes. This theme will give volunteer managers the opportunity to reflect on their own leadership style, how they lead volunteers within their own organization and how they harness leadership qualities in their volunteers. The conference will have a round table format which will encourage both discussion and sharing of ideas.

VOLT is the network of managers, both voluntary and paid, who spend the majority of their time coordinating the work of volunteers.

By communicating regularly and pooling resources, the network aims to:

- Provide mutual support
- Share knowledge and experience about good practice in volunteer management
- Provide a voice for the volunteer coordinator in Ireland

VOLT is the Irish network of volunteer coordinators, and is facilitated and administered by Volunteering Ireland. The importance of having a peer support forum for those individuals in organisations with responsibility for recruiting and retaining volunteers was first raised during a 1999 training workshop entitled 'Mission impossible?'. The network had its inaugural meeting in 2000.VOLT has a national steering committee with representatives from across Ireland. It organises national events, regional meetings and promotes other ways of networking.
