
magnetic leash



Upon entering the exhibit visitors learn that Phoebe came through the grid into the field, her dog Saturn with her but has disappeared. They must use what they know about magnetism to find Saturn and guide her out of the grid to return home. Once they find Saturn, they will be able to lead her through a portal, which will signify exiting the field.

Visitors continue through the maze following the lit floor panels that indicate strength and direction. They may have to crawl under panels descending from the ceiling, or around panels stemming from the floor or walls.

As the child nears Saturn the intensity of the light from the floor increases.

Upon finding Saturn (an image on the smartslabs on the floor), the visitor can interact with the exhibit. They now have a magnetic leash between themselves and Saturn. The wristband acts as the handle to the leash. The objective now is to lead Saturn out of the field.

As visitors pass from floor panel to panel, the RFID tag in their wristband registers their passing into the next panel and Saturn follows along. As visitors lead Saturn they must navigate through the maze. There are obstacles within the exhibit that impede the movement of Saturn. Visitors must lead Saturn over, under and around these obstacles to lead her out of the field.
