Do You Suffer From Hearing Loss?

Hearing loss is often a gradual process that worsens over time. Numerous factors can affect your hearing, including exposure to noise, sports, music and more. To help determine if you may have a hearing loss, take this simple test:

Yes No 1. You can hear, but you can't understand. High-pitched sounds, such as women's and children's voices may "disappear," plus confusion among sounds of words such as, "dime," "time," "bake," and "take."

- 2. You have difficulty understanding when there is background noise, such as in a restaurant or crowd.
- 3. You are continually asking people to repeat words or phrases.
 - 4. You prefer the TV or radio louder than others do.
- 5. You avoid social occasions, family gatherings or group meetings where listening may be difficult.

Hearing Loss Signs

(International Hearing Society)

- Family history of hearing loss.
- Repeated exposure to high noise levels.
- Feeling irritable or tired from the effort to hear.
- Straining to understand conversations and watching people's faces intently while listening.
- Frequently requiring others to repeat what has been said.
- Requiring increased volume for TV and radio while others complain of loudness.
- Ringing in the ears or dizziness.
- Medical history or diabetes, heart, thyroid, or circulation problems.
