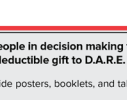

Dear friend,

Imagine the heartbeat of a parent watching their child struggle to keep up with classmates, feeling the weight of their child falling further behind with each passing day. When these parents reach out for help, hoping for understanding and support, they are often met with dismissal or indifference from school administrators.

The frustration of feeling unheard, combined with the emotional toll of watching their child struggle, can leave families feeling isolated and uncertain of where to turn for assistance.

Here in Maryland, too many children with disabilities or special healthcare needs are being left behind when they don't receive the support required to succeed.

When Christine's son, John, was in third grade, it became clear that he was facing significant challenges both socially and academically. John has a disability, and because he isn't receiving the critical support he needed, it was difficult for him to engage in the learning environment. As his struggles intensified, Christine reached out to school administrators for support, hoping to collaborate on a plan to help John succeed. Instead of finding a partner in this journey, she and her family were left with resistance and bullying.

NCSA Supports Public Safety As North Carolina Legislature Meets

The Honorary Members of the North Carolina Sheriffs' Association (NCSA) are making their voices heard in Raleigh, where NCSA is supporting legislative bills in the General Assembly related to improving public safety and promoting the Office of Sheriff.

NCSA has supported legislation to improve law enforcement recruitment and retention, as well as protecting our vulnerable children and communities from harmful and deadly controlled substances and the deaths who distribute them.

Each year, NCSA collaborates with legislators to enhance public safety for North Carolinians. The current "long session" of the North Carolina General Assembly convened on January 28. NCSA was proud to co-sponsor a reception to welcome legislators back to the state capital. Sheriffs from around the state and their personnel joined NCSA staff members to talk about issues important to the Association before the legislators began their work for this session. As NCSA's Executive Vice President and General Counsel, Edmond W. Caldwell Jr. explains, "This time together helps us understand each other's priorities as the legislative session gets underway."

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NCSA Leader to Chair Governor's Crime Commission

Honorary Members of the North Carolina Sheriffs' Association (NCSA) deserve to feel some pride over the Governor's appointment of an NCSA Executive Committee member and former NCSA President to chair North Carolina's Governor's Crime Commission.

Orange County Sheriff Charles S. Blackwood will lead the 44-member commission, which serves as the state's chief advisory body on crime and justice for the Governor and the Secretary of the Department of Public Safety. Sheriff Blackwood opened his first meeting as the commission's chairman on March 20 in Wilmington.

in Raleigh, and across the state. I am grateful that he has agreed to chair the commission and continue to help shape criminal justice policy in our state."

Sheriff Blackwood has served in law enforcement for more than four decades, starting his career in the Uniform Patrol Division of the Orange County Sheriff's Office in 1980, rising through the ranks until his election as Sheriff in 2014, serving three consecutive terms to date. In addition to serving as NCSA's President in 2022-23, Sheriff Blackwood was also appointed in 2021 to the Mental Health, Developmental Disabilities and Substance Abuse Services Board, and in 2020 to the SBI Center for the Analysis of Police Use of Force.

Members of the Governor's Crime Commission are drawn from leaders in statewide criminal justice and human service agencies, representatives from the courts, law enforcement, local government, the General Assembly, nonprofit agencies, private citizens, and youth representatives.

"NCSA is honored to have one of our distinguished past Presidents recognized by the Governor as a leader in law enforcement. I speak for our Honorary Members, and for all the sheriffs we represent and their staff, in wishing Sheriff Blackwood well in this new role," said Edmond W. Caldwell, Jr., NCSA's Executive Vice President and General Counsel. *

providing case status updates to victims, personnel from the Office of Sheriff help victims with the return of stolen or recovered property. They may even intercede with creditors, landlords, and employers on behalf of a victim.

Also, sheriffs and their deputies play a significant role in improving the treatment of victims within the criminal justice system. Advocates don't tell victims what to do — they provide guidance and assistance to victims so they can make informed decisions for themselves during very stressful times.

After a crisis, no amount of money can erase the trauma and grief that victims suffer, but the various forms of aid for victims that is offered through the Office of Sheriff can support recovery. The North Carolina Sheriffs' Association (NCSA) thanks its Honorary Members for their financial backing, which allows NCSA to support our state's sheriffs as they work diligently to support victims of crime, domestic violence, natural disasters, and other calamities. *

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The Office of Sheriff continues to evolve as its duties confront the realities of life in the 21st Century, but many aspects of the job have remained virtually unchanged throughout several centuries. For example, the second paragraph of the sheriff's oath of office remains almost the same as the one first prescribed in 1738. However, starting in the 1940s most county commissioners began to appoint a separate county official, no longer the sheriff, to collect taxes!

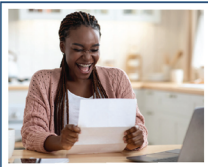
