






- Chichen Itza was a large city built by the Mayan Indians in 400 A.D.

- O Chichen Itza means "At the mouth of the well of Itza".
- Maya people that lived in Chichen Itza were soulptors, weavers, jewelers and potters.
- The Castillo is a monument in the shape of a pyramid in Chichen Itza.







Mexico Recipe NGC NO CO

A tortilla is a type of flat bread, made from finely ground corn (maize). In 1943, the wives of U.S. soldiers went on a shopping trip to nearby Piedras Nedras, Mexico. They arrived at a restaurant for lunch and the host, Ignacio "Nacho" Anaya, invented a snack using corn tortillas and cheese. He cut the tortillas into triangles, added shredded cheddar cheese, and served them warm. When asked what the dish was called, he said, "Nacho's especiale"! (Nacho's special)

ingredients:

1 bag of tortilla chips 1 bottle of enchilada sauce 1 lb (453 g) mild cheddar cheese, shredded Olives, tomatoes, sour cream (optional)

directions:

Ask an adult to pre-heat oven to 400° F/200° C. Spread tortilla chips in a single layer on a baking dish. Using a soup ladle, drizzle warm enchilada sauce over the chips. Sprinkle cheese on top of the sauce. Add olives and tomatoes on top. Ask the adult to heat in oven until the cheese is melted. Add sour cream in the center.




- Mexico is the largest Spanishspeaking country in the world.
- The Plaza de Toros in Mexico City is the largest bullfighting ring in the world.
- The Azteos and the Mayans were an advanced native population in Mexico.
- Mexico is located in the "Ring of Fire". This area is one of the world's most violent earthquake and volcano zones.
- Mexico City sinks 10 inches (25cm) each year, as it was built on an ancient lake.
- The Chihuahua is the smallest breed of dog in the world.
- Mexico is widely believed to have introduced chocolate, corn, and chilies to the world.
- When Spanish Conquistador Hernan Cortés arrived in 1519, the Aztecs believed he was their returning god and offered him the drink of the gods, hot chocolate.





- Six out of the world's seven turtle species nest along the Mexico coastline.
- The Green Turtle is named for the greenish color of its skin.
- These ancient creatures have been on earth for more than **100 million** years.
- Weighing up to 700 pounds (317.5 kg), green turtles are among the largest sea turtles in the world. They can live to be 100 years old.
- Unlike most sea turtles, adult green turtles are herbivorous, feeding on sea grasses and algae.
- Females dig a pit in the sand with their flippers, fill it with 100 to 200 eggs, cover the pit and return to the sea. The eggs hatch two months later.
- The most dangerous time of a green turtle's life is when it makes the journey from nest to sea.
- Of Green turtles are listed as an **endangered species.**





- The charro is the traditional outfit worn by a Mexican cowboy, made up of a short jacket and high tight black pants with metal buttons called "botonadura", and a sombrero hat. This hat has a very wide brim, and a chin strap to hold it in place.
- The name sombrero comes from the Spanish word sombra which means shade. Mexican cowboys, or vaqueros, adapted the hats that the Spanish brought with them to create the sombrero.
- Charro outfits are worn for formal events, weddings and in the traditional Folkloric Dance.
- The Mexican China Poblano folklore dresses are layered and have bright colored ribbons that go around the bottom of the dress and twirl as they dance.
- This dress is worn when dancing "El Jarabe Tapatio", "The Mexican Hat Dance", which is considered the national folk dance of Mexico.





- The symbol for the peso is **\$.**
- Q The peso is the currency of Mexico. There are one hundred Mexican cents (centavos) to every peso.
- O The name comes from the Spanish words **pesos oro** (gold weights) or **pesos plata** (silver weights).
- Mexican paper bills are printed in values of 20, 50, 100, 200, 500 and 1,000 pesos.
- O The front of the bills have portraits of important people in the history of Mexico and the backside shows important buildings.
- Q Mexican cent coins are issued in values of 5, 10, 20 and 50 cent (centavo) pieces.
- One side of all coins has the national shield of the country engraved on them, and the other side shows the value of the coin.
